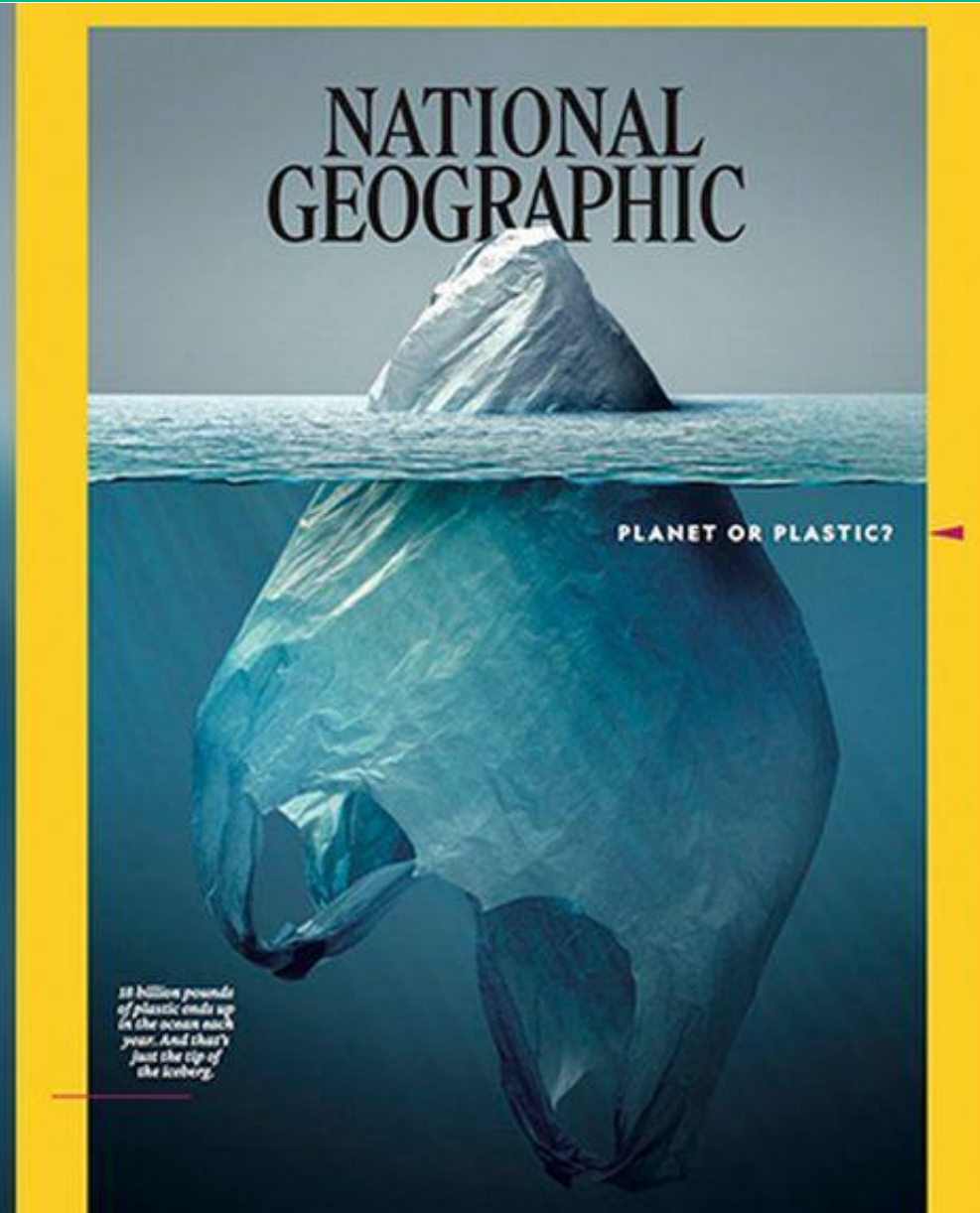

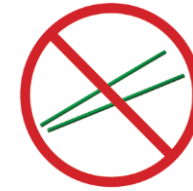
Mandatory Recycling and Composting

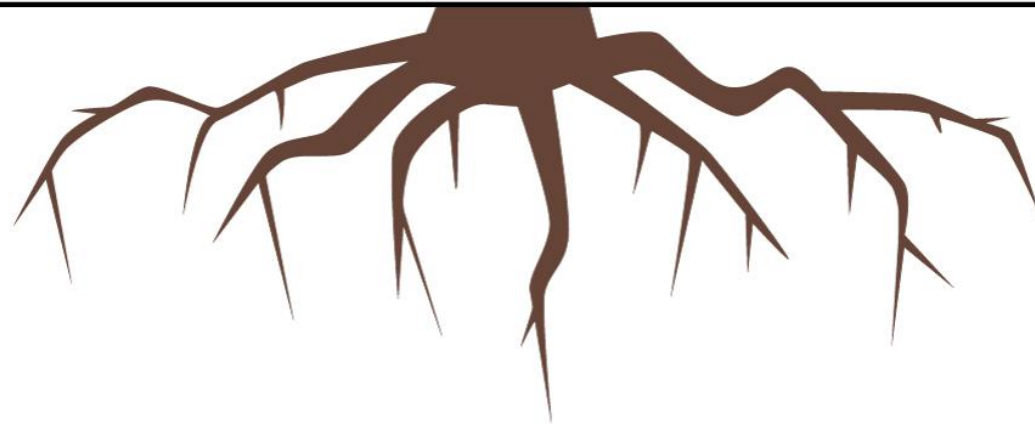

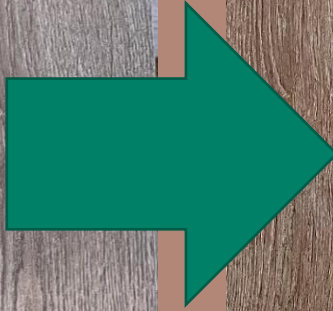
