1	[Settlement of Lawsuit - David Alfaro, et al \$3,626,444.85]
2	
3	Ordinance authorizing final settlement of the lawsuit filed by David Alfaro, et al. against
4	the City and County of San Francisco for \$3,626,444.85; the lawsuit was filed on August
5	20, 2015, in San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-15-547492; entitled <u>David</u>
6	Alfaro, et al. v. City and County of San Francisco; the lawsuit involves inverse
7	condemnation arising out of flooding damage during major rainstorms in December of
8	2014; this settlement relates only to the claims for statutory attorney's fees, costs and
9	interest and completely resolves the litigation.
10	
11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
12	Section 1. Pursuant to Charter Section 6.102(5), the Board of Supervisors hereby
13	authorizes the City Attorney to settle claims for statutory attorney's fees, costs and interest as
14	to all Plaintiffs and completely resolves the action entitled David Alfaro, et al. v. City and
15	County of San Francisco, San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-15-547492 by the
16	payment of \$3,626,444.85 to plaintiffs and their counsel. The lawsuit involves inverse
17	condemnation arising out of flooding damage during major rainstorms in December of 2014.
18	Section 2. The above-named action was filed in San Francisco Superior Court on
19	August 20, 2015. This is an action brought by owners or occupants of several dozen
20	properties located in San Francisco against defendant City and County of San Francisco.
21	Section 3. This is the final piece of a three-step settlement of the action. It resolves all
22	claims for statutory costs, interest, and attorney's fees due to all Plaintiffs. The parties have
23	previously, separately settled the personal and real property damage claims of all property
24	owners and diminution in value claims of all property owners in this action (see Board
25
