[Denouncing Anti-Asian American and Pacific Islander Rhetoric]

Resolution denouncing anti-Asian rhetoric and the use of racial campaign antics.

WHEREAS, Xenophobic imagery has been weaponized in the United States for over a century and has often served as a prelude in triggering a culture of anti-immigrant policies and practices; and

WHEREAS, The use of anti-Asian rhetoric and xenophobic imagery creates undue harms and traumatizes the Asian American community; and

WHEREAS, With the expansion of social media, failing to condemn the creation, development or circulation of anti-Asian depictions, particularly in light of a proliferation of anti-Asian hate attacks here in San Francisco and across the country, dangerously fuels and amplifies a culture of hateful sentiments; and

WHEREAS, According to the Stop AAPI Hate National Report, nearly 11,000 hate incidents against Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) persons were reported from March 19, 2020, to December 31, 2021, with California leading in the number of hate incidents with 38.6 percent of all reports; and

WHEREAS, Chinese Americans continue to report the most hate incidents of all ethnic groups at 42.8 percent, followed by Korean Americans at 16.1 percent, Philipino/a Americans at 8.9 percent, Japanese Americans at 8.2 percent, and Vietnamese Americans at 8 percent, with women making up 61.8 percent of all reports; and

WHEREAS, It is more critical now than ever to take a stand against all hateful stereotypes and xenophobia, and to break the silence against racism, sexism and hate incidents; and

WHEREAS, One year ago, on March 16, 2021, eight Asian Americans, six of whom were women, were tragically targeted as victims of a mass shooting at an Atlanta spa; and

WHEREAS, In reflecting on the anniversary of this hateful act of violence against the Asian American community, it is essential to do more beyond remembrances and apologies in order to stop the violence against our AAPI communities; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has previously taken stances opposing AAPI discrimination, harassment, hate, and violence and urging violence prevention, victim services and support on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File Nos. 210571, 210461, and 211240, which is hereby declared to be a part of this Resolution as if set forth fully herein; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors reaffirms its stance against all forms of AAPI violence and further denounces the use of anti-Asian rhetoric, imagery, and all forms of hate; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges greater investment in the AAPI community and infrastructure support to address and prevent escalating incidents of racial violence, and provide support for a systems-change.
