4	accept and expend federal funds sourced by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021		
5	and administered by the State Water Resources Control Board and the California		
6	Community Services Department, in the total amounts of \$7,309,988 and \$3,641,734		
7	respectively, to assist eligible residential and commercial customer accounts who		
8	accrued customer account arrears due to the COVID-19 pandemic between March 4,		
9	2020, through June 15, 2021.

11	WHEREAS, on February 25, 2020, Mayor London N. Breed declared San Francisco to		
12	be in a local state of emergency due to the threat of a novel (new) coronavirus (COVID-19),		
13	posing serious health threats to the population; and		
14	WHEREAS, On March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of		
15	emergency for all of California to protect against the threat of COVID-19; and		
16	WHEREAS, On March 13, 2020, Mayor Breed issued a second supplement to Mayoral		
17	Proclamation Declaring the Existence of a Local Emergency Dated February 25, 2020, stating		
18	that "the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) shall suspend for 60 days: (a)		
19	the discontinuation or shut off of water service for residents and businesses in the City for		
20	non-payment of water and sewer bills, (b) the discontinuation or shut off of power service for		
21	SFPUC Hetch Hetchy Power Customers in San Francisco for non-payment of power bills, (d)		
22	the imposition of late payment penalties or fees for delinquent Hetch Hetchy Power Customer		
23	accounts and (e) the return of delinquent CleanPowerSF Customers to PG&E generation		
24	service for failure to pay CleanPowerSF charges;" and

1 WHEREAS, On April 27, 2021, the SFPUC extended the suspension of shutoffs on 2 water and power service due to late or non-payment and the issuance of associated late 3 penalties and fees through March 31, 2022, through adopting Resolution No. 21-0063; and 4 WHEREAS, COVID-19 has and continues to harm the local and state economies due 5 to job loss, business closure, wage decreases, and other negative economic impacts; and 6 WHEREAS, The economic impact of COVID-19 has made affording utility bills difficult 7 for many SFPUC customers; and 8 WHEREAS, The number of delinquent customers and total overdue balances owed 9 across all customer types have increased substantially since March 2020, when the shelter-in-10 place order was announced; and 11 WHEREAS, The number of single family residential accounts with delinquent bills more 12 than 90 days past due almost tripled during the pandemic, going from 1,712 in March 2020 to 13 5,860 in October 2021; and 14 WHEREAS, Commercial customers with delinguent accounts more than 90 days past 15 due more than doubled, from 624 in March 2020 to 1,488 in October 2021; and 16 WHEREAS, On July 13, 2021, as part of the Fiscal Year 2021-22 State Budget Act (SB 17 129), \$985 million was appropriated from the Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Fund, established 18 by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, to the State of California Water Resources Control 19 Board (SWRCB) for payments to community water systems and \$1 billion was appropriated 20 from the same Fund to the State of California Department of Community Services (CSD) to 21 electric utilities to forgive residential and commercial customers arrearages that accrued 22 during the COVID-19 pandemic relief bill period (March 4, 2020, through June 15, 2021); and 23 WHEREAS, On July 16, 2021, as part of Assembly Bill 135, the requirements of the 24 California Arrearage Payment Program (CAPP) were established, and on July 23, 2021, as 25

part of Assembly Bill 148, the requirements of the California Water Wastewater Arrearages
 Program (CWWAPP) were established; and

WHEREAS, Water arrearages are prioritized; therefore, the details of the wastewater
program will not be released until after the water program is fully complete and all funds have
been dispersed; the wastewater program guidelines are expected no later than February 1,
2022; and

WHEREAS, The CAPP was established to address electric arrearages accumulated
during the pandemic and the state legislature allocated \$1 billion to electric utilities through
Assembly Bill 135; and

- WHEREAS, SFPUC submitted surveys to the State in September of 2021 with
   information on eligible residential and commercial water and electric arrearages; and
   WHEREAS, To qualify for both programs, a customer must be a residential or
   commercial customer that accrued arrearages during the COVID-19 pandemic, from March 4,
- 14 2020, to June 15, 2021; and
- WHEREAS, Under the CAPP program, the SFPUC applied for and received allocations
   for applicable electric customer arrearages from the California Department of Community
- 17 Services & Development, in the amounts of \$2,423,598 for the CleanPowerSF Community
- 18 Choice Aggregator and \$1,218,136 for the Hetch Hetchy Power municipal utility, from the
- 19 Department of Community Services and Development, for a total amount of \$3,641,734; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Under the CWWAPP program, the SFPUC applied for and has received
- 21 from the State Water Board an amount of \$7,309,988; and
- 22 WHEREAS, This grant does not include an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO)
- Amendment, and does not include funding for new staff members; and
- 24 WHEREAS, On November 23, 2021, the SFPUC Commission, by Resolution No. 21-
- 25 0178, recommended that the Board of Supervisors accept this grant; now, therefore, be it

1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the SFPUC to retroactively		
2	accept and expend grant funds in the amounts of \$7,309,988 and \$3,641,734, to pay off		
3	residential and commercial customer arrears accrued between March 4, 2020, and June 15,		
4	2021, pursuant to Administrative Code, Sec. 10.170-1; and, be it		
5	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the General Manager of the SFPUC is hereby authorized		
6	and empowered to execute, deliver, and perform, in the name of the City and County of San		
7	Francisco, all applications, contracts, agreements, amendments and payment requests		
8	necessary to secure the State grant funds and implement and carry out the purposes		
9	specified in the applicable grant application; and, be it		
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors ratifies any administrative		
11	action taken to date with respect to these grants and grant funds.
