4	commemorate the 30 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the world's first LGBT-identified cheerleading
5	team that raises funds for local, national, and international service agencies.

7	WHEREAS, CHEER San Francisco became the first Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and
8	Transgendered (LGBT)-identified cheerleading team in 1980 and has represented the unique
9	diversity of the City and County of San Francisco for thirty years by performing for millions of
10	people locally, nationally, and internationally; and
11	WHEREAS, In 1993, CHEER San Francisco became the first non-profit and
12	community-based cheerleading team whose primary mission is to raise funds for agencies
13	providing services to individuals living with HIV/AIDS, breast cancer, and other challenges
14	through the team's philanthropic CHEER For Life campaign; and
15	WHEREAS, Since 2002, CHEER San Francisco has partnered with local professional
16	athletic organizations, including the San Francisco Giants and the San Francisco 49ers, to
17	raise thousands of charitable dollars in conjunction with fans of professional sports; and
