

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - No Violence Alliance One Family Reentry Initiative -
2 \$300,000]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Sheriff's Department to retroactively apply for,**
4 **accept, and expend \$300,000 in funds from the Bureau of Justice Assistance,**
5 **through the Second Chance Act Prisoner Reentry Initiative. The No Violence**
6 **Alliance One Family Reentry Initiative will provide a comprehensive, family-**
7 **focused continuum from in-custody to post-release for sentenced probationers**
8 **incarcerated in the San Francisco County Jail with a history of substance abuse**
9 **and minor children.**

11 WHEREAS, The Second Chance Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-199) provides a
12 comprehensive response to the increasing number of people who are released from
13 prison and jail and returning to communities, including resources to address the myriad
14 needs of these offenders to achieve a successful return to their communities. Section
15 213 of the Second Chance Act specifically addresses the treatment and needs of
16 offenders who have substance abuse disorders and who are parents of minors; and

17 WHEREAS, The Sheriff's Department proposes to maximize use of available grant
18 funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs; now therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby waive indirect costs;
20 and be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the funds received will target offenders from the
22 San Francisco County Jail with substance abuse disorders and who are parents of
23 minor children; and be it


1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Sheriff's Department will provide a program
2 coordinator and two case manager totaling an in-kind amount of \$516,762; and be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will
4 participate in data collection on key variables related to client-level performance and
5 outcome data as required; and be it


6 FURTHER RESOLVED, The Sheriff's Department is authorized to furnish
7 whatever additional information or assurances the funding agency may request in
8 connection with this grant, and execute any and all agreements necessary to complete
9 the transfer of funds. The grant period is from October 01, 2010 to September 30, 2012;
10 and be it


11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco assures that
12 it will abide by the statutes governing the Bureau of Justice Assistance as well as the
13 terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the U.S. Department of
14 Justice, Office of Justice Programs.

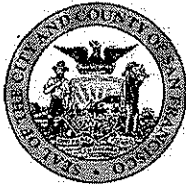
