# **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Conflict of interest code amendments]

Ordinance amending Chapter 1 of Article III of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code by (1) amending section 3.1-103 to list the officials who must file statements of economic interests and ethics-related forms with the Ethics Commission; (2) amending section 3.1-107 to clarify the scope of disclosure category 1; (3) amending sections 3.1-140, 3.1-150, 3.1-155, 3.1-175, 3.1-190, 3.1-195, 3.1-205, 3.1-207, 3.1-218, 3.1-230, 3.1-240, 3.1-245, 3.1-250, 3.1-251, 3.1-253, 3.1-267, 3.1-275, 3.1-280, 3.1-312, 3.1-315, 3.1-320, 3.1-335, 3.1-362, 3.1-365, 3.1-390, 3.1-422, 3.1-445, 3.1-450 to update the list of designated employees who must file statements of economic interests; (4) deleting sections 3.1-210 and 3.1-235 to reflect the current composition of City departments; and (5) adding section 3.1-510 to identify the local officials who manage public investments.

#### **Existing Law**

The Political Reform Act of 1974, California Government Code § 87300, et seq., requires that San Francisco adopt a Conflict of Interest Code and review and update the Code every two years. The City's Conflict of Interest Code is set forth in Article III, Chapter 1 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code. The Code designates those City officials and employees who periodically must file public statements disclosing their personal financial interests. The Code also specifies the types of financial interests that designated officials and employees must disclose.

### Amendments to Current Law

The proposed amendments to the Conflict of Interest Code identify the local officials who must file statements of economic interests and ethics-related forms with the Ethics Commission. The proposed amendments also clarify that "disclosure category 1," the most expansive category of disclosure, includes gifts.

The proposed amendments encompass the sections of the Conflict of Interest Code governing the following City agencies: Arts Commission, Board of Supervisors, Department of Building Inspection, City Attorney, Community College District, Controller, District Attorney, Department of Economic Workforce and Development, Department of Emergency Management, Ethics Commission, Film Commission, Fine Arts Museums, Fire Department, General Services Agency – City Administrator, General Services Agency – Department of Technology, Health Service System, Department of Human Resources, Human Rights Commission, Local Agency Formation Commission, Mayor's Office, Municipal Transportation Agency, Planning Department, Department of Public Health, Public Utilities Commission, Recreation and Park Department, Office of Small Business, Treasurer-Tax Collector, and War Memorial and Performing Arts Center.

#### FILE NO. 101272

The proposed amendments delete the section of the Conflict of Interest Code governing the members of the Board of Examiners, Plumbing, Electrical, and High-Rise Sprinklers. These positions are already included in the Department of Building Inspection's section of the Conflict of Interest Code. The proposed amendments also delete the section of the Conflict of Interest Code governing the Economic Opportunity Council. The Economic Opportunity Council is a private, non-profit organization – not a City agency.

Lastly, the proposed amendments add section 3.1-510 to the Conflict of Interest Code. Under a recently-enacted state law (SB 1271), local conflict of interest codes must specifically identify the local officials who manage public investments for the purposes of Government Code section 87200. Section 3.1-510 addresses this new state law requirement.

## Background

The City's conflict of interest code must list those employees and officers who make or participate in the making of governmental decisions on behalf of the City. *Id.* § 82019(a)(3). A City employee or officer "makes a governmental decision" when he or she: (1) votes on a matter; (2) appoints a person; (3) obligates or commits his or her agency to any course of action; or (4) enters into any contractual agreement on behalf of his or her agency. 2 C.C.R. § 18702.1. A City employee or officer "participates in making a governmental decision" when he or she directly, without significant substantive review: (1) negotiates with a governmental entity or private person regarding a governmental decision; or (2) advises or makes recommendations to the final decision-maker by conducting research or an investigation, or preparing or presenting a report, analysis or opinion. *Id.* § 18702.2. The City's conflict of interest code should not include employees who carry out solely clerical or ministerial tasks. *See id.* § 18702.4 (a).
