11	L.P. (AKA Hotel Union Square), and 345 Taylor Owner LLC (AKA Tilden Hotel).
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13	WHEREAS, California Government Code, Section 54956.9 and San Francisco
14	Administrative Code, Section 67.10(d)(2) allow the Board of Supervisors to convene in closed
15	session to confer with or receive advice from legal counsel regarding anticipated litigation; and
16	WHEREAS, Beginning in March 2020, the City procured hotel rooms to allow people
17	who had contracted or been exposed to COVID-19 to isolate and quarantine, and to allow
18	people experiencing homelessness to safely shelter in place; and
19	WHEREAS, In total, the City entered into booking contracts with 29 hotels, 14 of which
20	are still leased and occupied by the City; and

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WHEREAS, Several of the hotels that provided rooms pursuant to these contracts now allege that the City's occupancy resulted in significant damage to real and personal property, and have filed claims or made demands against the City for compensation for the alleged damage; now, therefore, be it
