[Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) - DP21-2111 Closing the Gap with Social Determinants of Health Accelerator Plans - \$125,000]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$125,000 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for participation in a program, entitled "DP21-2111 Closing the Gap with Social Determinants of Health Accelerator Plans," for the period of September 30, 2021, through September 29, 2022.

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has agreed to fund the Department of Public Health (DPH) in the amount of \$125,000 for participation in a program, entitled "DP21-2111 Closing the Gap with Social Determinants of Health Accelerator Plans," for the period of September 30, 2021, through September 29, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Chronic disease is disproportionately impacting the San Franciscans of Black/African American ancestry to an extreme degree; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Black African American-focused Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Accelerator plan to improve the Black African American health disparities by focusing on two social determinants: Food Security, and Community-Clinical Linkages; and

WHEREAS, The Accelerator plan will focus on disparity in cardiovascular disease incidence and severity, and the food and nutrition needed to prevent and manage cardiovascular disease; and

WHEREAS, The Leadership team developing the Accelerator plan will include representatives of clinical providers, community-based organizations, a nationally recognized academic institution, DPH, the San Francisco Human Services Agency, and residents with lived experience; and

WHEREAS, The Leadership team will cross-train to gain a shared understanding, then meet regularly within a collective impact framework to generate a shared objective, metrics, proposed activities, and evaluation plan; and

WHEREAS, These recommendations will be evaluated using a Health Equity Impact Tool, then be presented to the community and potential partners as an action plan for improving the health of the Black/African American community; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DPH received the agreement on September 13, 2021, for a project start date of September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, The Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$125,000 from the CDC; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend the grant funds pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 10.170-1.
