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3	Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on November
4	8, 2022, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to change the
5	election cycle for the offices of Mayor, Sheriff, District Attorney, City Attorney and
6	Treasurer so that these offices will be elected in even-numbered years; to provide that the
7	current term for the aforementioned offices will end on January 8, 2025 rather than
8	January 8, 2024; to amend the definition of general municipal election so that such
9	elections occur only in even-numbered years; and to change the signature threshold for
10	initiative ordinances to two percent of the number of registered voters in San Francisco.

13	Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City
14	and County, at an election to be held on November 8, 2022, a proposal to amend the Charter of
15	the City and County by revising Sections 13.101, 14.101, and Article XVII, to read as follows:

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21	SEC. 13.101. TERMS OF ELECTIVE OFFICE.
22	(a) Except in the case of an appointment or election to fill a vacancy, the term of office
23	of each elected officer shall commence at 12:00 noon on the eighth day of January following the
24	date of the election.

1	(b) Subject to the applicable provisions of Section 13.102, the elected officers of the City
2	and County, and members of the Board of Education and of the Governing Body of the
3	Community College District, shall be elected as follows:
4	(1) At the general municipal election in 1995 and every fourth year thereafter, a
5	The following officials shall be elected at the general municipal election in 2024 and every
6	fourth year thereafter: Mayor, a-Sheriff, and a-District Attorney-, City Attorney, Treasurer, four
7	members of the Board of Education, and four members of the Governing Board of the
8	Community College District.
9	(2) Four members of the Board of Education and four members of the Governing
10	Board of the Community College District shall be elected at the general municipal election in
11	1996 and every fourth year thereafter, four members of the Board of Education and four
12	members of the Governing Board of the Community College District shall be elected.
13	(3) At the general municipal election in 2013, and at the general municipal
14	election in 2015 and every fourth year thereafter, a City Attorney and a Treasurer shall be
15	elected. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Charter including Section 6.100, the term of
16	office for the person elected City Attorney or Treasurer at the general municipal election in 2013
17	shall be two years.
18	(42) The following officials shall be elected at the general municipal election in
19	2022 and every fourth year thereafter: At the general municipal election in 2006 and every fourth
20	year thereafter, an Assessor-Recorder, and Public Defender, three members of the Board of
21	Education, and three members of the Governing Board of the Community College District.
22	(5) At the general municipal election in 1998 and every fourth year thereafter,
23	three members of the Board of Education and three members of the Governing Board of the
24	Community College District shall be elected.

1	(63) The election and terms of office of members of the Board of Supervisors
2	shall be governed by Section 13.110.
3	(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Charter, including Section 3.101, the
4	term of office for Mayor, City Attorney, District Attorney, Sheriff, and Treasurer that began at
5	noon on January 8, 2020 shall end at noon on January 8, 2025. This five-year term for the office
6	of Mayor shall be deemed a single term for the purposes of term limits under Section 3.101.

9	SEC. 14.101. INITIATIVES.
10	An initiative may be proposed by presenting to the Director of Elections a petition
11	containing the initiative and signed by voters in a number equal to at least five two percent of the
12	number of registered voters in the City and Countyvotes cast for all candidates for mayor in the
13	last preceding general municipal election for Mayor. Such initiative shall be submitted to the
14	voters by the Director of Elections upon certification of the sufficiency of the petition's
15	signatures.

18	ARTICLE XVII: DEFINITIONS
19	For all purposes of this Charter, the following terms shall have the meanings specified
20	below:
21	* * * *
22	"General municipal election" shall mean the election for local officials or measures to be
23	held in the City and County on the Tuesday immediately following the first Monday in
24	November in every year until and including 202215. Thereafter, "general municipal election"
25	shall mean the election for local officials or measures to be held in the City and County on the

1	Tuesday immediately following the first Monday in November in all even-numbered years and
2	in every fourth year following 2015.
