

3	Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters, at an election to be held on November
4	8, 2022, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco, to create the
5	Housing and Community Development Commission to oversee the Housing and
6	Community Development Department, and to establish the Housing and Community
7	Development Department as a City department to succeed to the powers and duties of the
8	Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development.

10	Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City
11	and County, at an election to be held on November 8, 2022, a proposal to amend the Charter of
12	the City and County by adding Section 4.144 and revising Sections 15.105 and 16.110, to read as
13	follows:

16	Asterisks (* * * *) indicate the omission of unchanged Charter subsections.
17	
18	SEC. 4.144. HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION.
19	(a) Purpose. There is hereby established a Housing and Community Development
20	Commission ("Commission"). The Commission shall set policy and provide oversight for the
21	Housing and Community Development Department ("Department").
22	(b) Membership and Terms of Office.
23	(1) The Commission shall consist of seven members, appointed as follows:
24	(A) Seats 1, 2, and 3 shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to
25	approval by the Board of Supervisors. Seat 4 shall be appointed by the Treasurer subject to

1	approval by the Board of Supervisors. Each nomination of the Mayor and the Treasurer shall be
2	subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors, and shall be the subject of a public hearing and
3	vote within 60 days of the date the Clerk of the Board receives notice of the nomination from the
4	Mayor or Treasurer. If the Board fails to act on the nomination within those 60 days, the
5	nominee shall be deemed approved. The appointment shall become effective on the date the
6	Board adopts a motion approving the nomination or on the 61st day after the Clerk of the Board
7	receives notice of the nomination, whichever is earlier.
8	(B) Seats 5, 6, and 7 shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
9	(2) Commissioners shall serve four-year terms, beginning at noon on April 1,
10	2023, except that the initial term of the appointees in Seats 1, 4, and 7 shall expire at noon on
11	April 1, 2025. The initial term of the appointees in Seats 2, 3, 5, and 6 shall expire at noon on
12	<u>April 1, 2027.</u>
13	(3) Commissioners may be removed from office by their appointing authority
14	only for official misconduct under Article XV.
15	(c) Powers and Duties. With regard to the Department, once the Commission comes
16	into existence as specified in subsection (e)(2), the Commission shall exercise all the powers and
17	duties of boards and commissions set forth in Sections 4.102, 4.103, and 4.104, except as
18	modified in this subsection (c), and shall assume such other powers and duties, if any, as
19	prescribed by ordinance. Notwithstanding Sections 3.100(19) and 4.102(5), the Commission
20	shall appoint the Director of the Department.
21	(d) Housing and Community Development Department. Except as otherwise
22	provided in this Charter, the Department shall:
23	(1) provide for the development, construction, rehabilitation, preservation, or
24	purchase of affordable housing in the City for low-income and moderate-income households;
25	(2) administer programs for the development, construction, rehabilitation.

1	preservation, or purchase of affordable housing in the City for low-income and moderate-income
2	households;
3	(3) administer programs to finance the purchase and sale of housing in the
4	City by low-income and moderate-income homeowners;
5	(4) acquire and convey real property for the development, construction, or
6	preservation of affordable housing in the City for low-income and moderate-income households;
7	(5) administer the City's below-market-rate inclusionary housing program;
8	(6) administer grants programs to support community development in the
9	<u>City; and</u>
10	(7) undertake any other responsibilities prescribed in Section 16.110 or by
11	ordinance.
12	(e) Transition provisions.
13	(1) The Mayor and the Treasurer shall make initial appointments to seats 1, 2,
14	3, and 4, respectively, on the Commission by no later than January 31, 2023, and the Board of
15	Supervisors shall make initial appointments to seats 5, 6, and 7 by no later than March 1, 2023.
16	(2) The Commission and the Department shall come into existence at noon on
17	April 1, 2023, or when four members of the Commission have assumed office, whichever is later.
18	On the date the Commission and the Department come into existence, the Department shall
19	succeed to the powers and duties of the previously existing Mayor's Office of Housing and
20	Community Development, and that Office shall cease to exist.
21	(3) The Commission shall hold its inaugural meeting no later than 30 days
22	after the Commission comes into existence.
23	(4) The Director of the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community
24	Development, or the acting director of that Office, on the date the Department comes into
25	existence shall serve as the Director of the Department beginning on that date. That first head of

1	the Department shall have the same employment status as other department heads under the
2	Charter; hence, the previous sentence does not deprive the Commission of its authority under the
3	Charter to remove a department head, or to appoint a department head in accordance with
4	subsection (c).
5	(f) Existing Contracts. Nothing in this Section 4.144 shall be interpreted to impair
6	the obligations of any existing contract entered into by the City before April 1, 2023, or require
7	the City to abandon a competitive bid or contractor selection process initiated before that date.
8	
9	SEC. 15.105. SUSPENSION AND REMOVAL.
10	(a) ELECTIVE <u>OFFICERS</u> AND <u>CERTAIN APPOINTED</u> OFFICERS <u>ON CERTAIN</u>
11	BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR. Any elective officer, and any
12	member of the Airport Commission, Asian Art Commission, Civil Service Commission,
13	Commission on the Status of Women, Golden Gate Concourse Authority Board of Directors,
14	Health Commission, Human Services Commission, Juvenile Probation Commission, Municipal
15	Transportation Agency Board of Directors, Port Commission, Public Utilities Commission,
16	Recreation and Park Commission, Fine Arts Museums Board of Trustees, War Memorial and
17	Performing Art Center Board of Trustees, Board of Education or Community College Board is
18	subject to suspension and removal for official misconduct as provided in this section. Such
19	officer may be suspended by the Mayor and the Mayor shall appoint a qualified person to
20	discharge the duties of the office during the period of suspension. Upon such suspension, the
21	Mayor shall immediately notify the Ethics Commission and Board of Supervisors thereof in
22	writing and the cause thereof, and shall present written charges against such suspended officer to
23	the Ethics Commission and Board of Supervisors at or prior to their next regular meetings
24	following such suspension, and shall immediately furnish a copy of the same to such officer,
25	who shall have the right to appear <i>in their defense</i> with counsel before the Ethics Commission- <i>in</i>

1	<i>his or her defense</i> . The Ethics Commission shall hold a hearing not less than five days after the
2	filing of written charges. After the hearing, the Ethics Commission shall transmit the full record
3	of the hearing to the Board of Supervisors with a recommendation as to whether the charges
4	should be sustained. If, after reviewing the complete record, the charges are sustained by not less
5	than a three-fourths vote of all members of the Board of Supervisors, the suspended officer shall
6	be removed from office; if not so sustained, or if not acted on by the Board of Supervisors within
7	30 days after the receipt of the record from the Ethics Commission, the suspended officer shall
8	thereby be reinstated.
9	(b) BUILDING INSPECTION COMMISSION, PLANNING COMMISSION, BOARD
10	OF APPEALS, ELECTIONS COMMISSION, ETHICS COMMISSION, SHERIFF'S
11	DEPARTMENT OVERSIGHT BOARD, AND ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSIONOFFICERS ON
12	CERTAIN BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS WITH MULTIPLE APPOINTING OFFICERS.
13	Members of the Building Inspection Commission, the Planning Commission, the Board of
14	Appeals, the Elections Commission, the Ethics Commission, the Sheriff's Department Oversight
15	Board, the Housing and Community Development Commission, and the Entertainment
16	Commission may be suspended and removed pursuant to the provisions of subsection (a) of this
17	section except that the Mayor may initiate removal only of the Mayor's appointees and the
18	appointing authority shall act in place of the Mayor for all other appointees.

21	SEC. 16.110. HOUSING TRUST FUND.
22	(a) Creation of Fund. There is hereby established a Housing Trust Fund to support
23	creating, acquiring, and rehabilitating affordable housing and promoting affordable home
24	ownership programs in the City, as provided in this Section <u>16.110</u> .
25	(b) Definitions. For purposes of this Section <u>16.110</u> :

"Mayor's Office of Housing" shall mean the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development or any successor City agency.

Uses of the Housing Trust Fund. The City may disburse monies from the 5 (d) 6 Housing Trust Fund through loans, grants, or other types of payments, on terms determined by 7 the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department in its sole 8 discretion. Any repayment of a loan or grant from the Fund that the City receives, or any interest 9 from a loan from the Fund that the City receives, will be returned to the Housing Trust Fund. The City, acting through the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development 10 Department, shall disburse the monies from the Housing Trust Fund for the following eligible 11 expenditures: 12 (1)13 The creation, acquisition, and rehabilitation of rental and ownership housing affordable to Households earning up to 120% of the Area Median Income, including, 14 without limitation, the acquisition of land for such purpose. 15 No later than July 1, 2018, the City shall appropriate \$15 million from the 16 (2)17 Housing Trust Fund to a program that provides loans to Households earning up to 120% of the 18 Area Median Income and to Households including a First Responder (subject to Area Median Income limits designated by the *Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community* 19 20 Development Department) for use as a down payment on the purchase of a housing unit ("the 21 Down Payment Assistance Loan Program"). As soon as is practical, the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department shall develop and implement a 22 manual for the Down Payment Assistance Loan Program. 23 No later than July 1, 2018, the City shall appropriate up to \$15 million 24 (3) 25 from the Housing Trust Fund to a program that provides funds to Households earning up to

120% of Area Median Income for use as assistance to reduce the risk to current occupants of a
 loss of housing and/or to help current occupants make their homes safer, more accessible, more
 energy efficient, and more sustainable (the "Housing Stabilization Program"). As soon as is
 practical, the *Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department* shall
 implement and develop a manual for the Housing Stabilization Program.

6 (4) The City may use monies in the Housing Trust Fund to operate and 7 administer the Infrastructure Grant Program as described in subsection (e). The City may not 8 allocate to the Infrastructure Grant Program in any fiscal year an amount exceeding the greater of 9 \$2 million or 10% of the amount appropriated to the Housing Trust Fund for that fiscal year 10 under subsection (c).

(5) In any fiscal year, the City may allocate a sufficient amount from the
Housing Trust Fund to pay for all legally permissible administrative costs of the Fund, including,
without limitation, legal costs, associated with any use of the Housing Trust Fund.

14 (e) Complete Neighborhoods Infrastructure Grant Program. After conferring with the Director of Planning, the Director of the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and 15 Community Development Department shall design and administer a Complete Neighborhoods 16 17 Infrastructure Grant Program ("Infrastructure Grant Program"). The purpose of the Infrastructure 18 Grant Program is to accelerate the build-out of the public realm infrastructure needed to support 19 increased residential density in the City's neighborhoods. The City may use monies from the 20 Infrastructure Grant Program only for public facilities identified in the Community Facilities 21 District law (Cal. Govt. Code §§ 53311 et seq., as amended), and shall give priority to the use of such monies by residential development project sponsors, community-based organizations, and 22 City departments for public realm improvements associated with proposed residential 23 24 development projects.

1	(f) Bonding Authority. Notwithstanding the limitations set forth in Sections
2	9.107, 9.108, and 9.109 of this Charter, upon recommendation of the Mayor, the Board of
3	Supervisors may authorize the issuance, without limitation, of revenue bonds, lease financing,
4	notes, or other evidences of indebtedness or other obligations ("Debt Obligations"), the proceeds
5	of which are to be used for creating, acquiring, and rehabilitating rental and ownership housing
6	affordable to Households earning up to 120% of the Area Median Income, including, without
7	limitation, the acquisition of land for such purpose. Such Debt Obligations shall be secured by
8	and/or repaid from any available funds pledged or appropriated by Board of Supervisors
9	ordinance for such purpose, which amount may include funds in the Housing Trust Fund
10	allocated under subsection (c). Debt Obligations authorized hereby shall be issued in accordance
11	with the <i>Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department</i> policies,
12	and upon the terms and conditions as the Board of Supervisors shall approve. Funds appropriated
13	to pay debt service on the Debt Obligations in such fiscal year under the terms of this Section
14	<u>16.110(f)</u> shall be set aside in an account for such use until such payment is made.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Charter Amendment - Housing and Community Development Commission and Department]

Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters, at an election to be held on November 8, 2022, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco, to create the Housing and Community Development Commission to oversee the Housing and Community Development Department, and to establish the Housing and Community Development Department as a City department to succeed to the powers and duties of the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development.

Existing Law

The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development ("MOHCD") provides financing and administers programs for the development, construction, rehabilitation, and preservation of affordable housing in the City; provides financing and administers programs to assist lowand moderate-income homeowners purchase homes; administers the City's below-marketrate inclusionary housing program; and administers grant programs to support community development. The Mayor appoints and may remove the head of MOHCD. MOHCD is not subject to direct oversight by a City commission.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed Charter amendment would create the Housing and Development Commission (the "Commission"). The Commission would have seven members, three appointed by the Mayor, three appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and one appointed by the Treasurer. The Mayor's and Treasurer's nominees would be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors within 60 days of the appointment. The appointing authorities could remove commissioners only for official misconduct through the process provided in the Charter for removal of members of other commissions. Commissioners would serve four-year terms (except for three commissioners serving initial two-year terms).

The Commission would oversee a newly formed department—the Housing and Community Development Department—which would generally take over the powers and duties of MOHCD. The Commission would have the power to appoint, review, and remove the director of the new Department.

21	(d) Housing and Community Development Department. Except as otherwise
22	provided in this Charter, the Department shall:
23	(1) provide for the development, construction, rehabilitation, preservation, or
24	purchase of affordable housing in the City for low-income and moderate-income households;
25	(2) administer programs for the development, construction, rehabilitation,

1	preservation, or purchase of affordable housing in the City for low-income and moderate-income
2	households;
3	(3) administer programs to finance the purchase and sale of housing in the
4	City by low-income and moderate-income homeowners;
5	(4) acquire and convey real property for the development, construction, or
6	preservation of affordable housing in the City for low-income and moderate-income households;
7	(5) administer the City's below-market-rate inclusionary housing program;
8	(6) administer grants programs to support community development in the
9	<u>City; and</u>
10	(7) undertake any other responsibilities prescribed in Section 16.110 or by
11	ordinance.
12	(e) Transition provisions.
13	(1) The Mayor and the Treasurer shall make initial appointments to seats 1, 2,
14	3, and 4, respectively, on the Commission by no later than January 31, 2023, and the Board of
15	Supervisors shall make initial appointments to seats 5, 6, and 7 by no later than March 1, 2023.
16	(2) The Commission and the Department shall come into existence at noon on
17	April 1, 2023, or when four members of the Commission have assumed office, whichever is later.
18	On the date the Commission and the Department come into existence, the Department shall
19	succeed to the powers and duties of the previously existing Mayor's Office of Housing and
20	Community Development, and that Office shall cease to exist.
21	(3) The Commission shall hold its inaugural meeting no later than 30 days
22	after the Commission comes into existence.
23	(4) The Director of the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community
24	Development, or the acting director of that Office, on the date the Department comes into
25	existence shall serve as the Director of the Department beginning on that date. That first head of

1	the Department shall have the same employment status as other department heads under the
2	Charter; hence, the previous sentence does not deprive the Commission of its authority under the
3	Charter to remove a department head, or to appoint a department head in accordance with
4	subsection (c).
5	(f) Existing Contracts. Nothing in this Section 4.144 shall be interpreted to impair
6	the obligations of any existing contract entered into by the City before April 1, 2023, or require
7	the City to abandon a competitive bid or contractor selection process initiated before that date.

9	SEC. 15.105. SUSPENSION AND REMOVAL.
10	(a) ELECTIVE <u>OFFICERS</u> AND <u>CERTAIN APPOINTED</u> OFFICERS <u>ON CERTAIN</u>
11	BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR. Any elective officer, and any
12	member of the Airport Commission, Asian Art Commission, Civil Service Commission,
13	Commission on the Status of Women, Golden Gate Concourse Authority Board of Directors,
14	Health Commission, Human Services Commission, Juvenile Probation Commission, Municipal
15	Transportation Agency Board of Directors, Port Commission, Public Utilities Commission,
16	Recreation and Park Commission, Fine Arts Museums Board of Trustees, War Memorial and
17	Performing Art Center Board of Trustees, Board of Education or Community College Board is
18	subject to suspension and removal for official misconduct as provided in this section. Such
19	officer may be suspended by the Mayor and the Mayor shall appoint a qualified person to
20	discharge the duties of the office during the period of suspension. Upon such suspension, the
21	Mayor shall immediately notify the Ethics Commission and Board of Supervisors thereof in
22	writing and the cause thereof, and shall present written charges against such suspended officer to
23	the Ethics Commission and Board of Supervisors at or prior to their next regular meetings
24	following such suspension, and shall immediately furnish a copy of the same to such officer,
25	who shall have the right to appear <i>in their defense</i> with counsel before the Ethics Commission- <i>in</i>

1	his or her defense. The Ethics Commission shall hold a hearing not less than five days after the
2	filing of written charges. After the hearing, the Ethics Commission shall transmit the full record
3	of the hearing to the Board of Supervisors with a recommendation as to whether the charges
4	should be sustained. If, after reviewing the complete record, the charges are sustained by not less
5	than a three-fourths vote of all members of the Board of Supervisors, the suspended officer shall
6	be removed from office; if not so sustained, or if not acted on by the Board of Supervisors within
7	30 days after the receipt of the record from the Ethics Commission, the suspended officer shall
8	thereby be reinstated.
9	(b) BUILDING INSPECTION COMMISSION, PLANNING COMMISSION, BOARD
10	OF APPEALS, ELECTIONS COMMISSION, ETHICS COMMISSION, SHERIFF'S
11	DEPARTMENT OVERSIGHT BOARD, AND ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSIONOFFICERS ON
12	CERTAIN BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS WITH MULTIPLE APPOINTING OFFICERS.
13	Members of the Building Inspection Commission, the Planning Commission, the Board of
14	Appeals, the Elections Commission, the Ethics Commission, the Sheriff's Department Oversight
15	Board, the Housing and Community Development Commission, and the Entertainment
16	Commission may be suspended and removed pursuant to the provisions of subsection (a) of this
17	section except that the Mayor may initiate removal only of the Mayor's appointees and the
18	appointing authority shall act in place of the Mayor for all other appointees.

21	SEC. 16.110. HOUSING TRUST FUND.
22	(a) Creation of Fund. There is hereby established a Housing Trust Fund to support
23	creating, acquiring, and rehabilitating affordable housing and promoting affordable home
24	ownership programs in the City, as provided in this Section <u>16.110</u> .
25	(b) Definitions. For purposes of this Section <u>16.110</u> :

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"Mayor's Office of Housing" shall mean the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development or any successor City agency.

Uses of the Housing Trust Fund. The City may disburse monies from the 5 (d) 6 Housing Trust Fund through loans, grants, or other types of payments, on terms determined by 7 the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department in its sole 8 discretion. Any repayment of a loan or grant from the Fund that the City receives, or any interest 9 from a loan from the Fund that the City receives, will be returned to the Housing Trust Fund. The City, acting through the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development 10 Department, shall disburse the monies from the Housing Trust Fund for the following eligible 11 expenditures: 12 (1)13 The creation, acquisition, and rehabilitation of rental and ownership housing affordable to Households earning up to 120% of the Area Median Income, including, 14 without limitation, the acquisition of land for such purpose. 15 No later than July 1, 2018, the City shall appropriate \$15 million from the 16 (2)17 Housing Trust Fund to a program that provides loans to Households earning up to 120% of the 18 Area Median Income and to Households including a First Responder (subject to Area Median Income limits designated by the *Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community* 19 20 Development Department) for use as a down payment on the purchase of a housing unit ("the 21 Down Payment Assistance Loan Program"). As soon as is practical, the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department shall develop and implement a 22 manual for the Down Payment Assistance Loan Program. 23 No later than July 1, 2018, the City shall appropriate up to \$15 million 24 (3) 25 from the Housing Trust Fund to a program that provides funds to Households earning up to

120% of Area Median Income for use as assistance to reduce the risk to current occupants of a
 loss of housing and/or to help current occupants make their homes safer, more accessible, more
 energy efficient, and more sustainable (the "Housing Stabilization Program"). As soon as is
 practical, the *Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department* shall
 implement and develop a manual for the Housing Stabilization Program.

6 (4) The City may use monies in the Housing Trust Fund to operate and 7 administer the Infrastructure Grant Program as described in subsection (e). The City may not 8 allocate to the Infrastructure Grant Program in any fiscal year an amount exceeding the greater of 9 \$2 million or 10% of the amount appropriated to the Housing Trust Fund for that fiscal year 10 under subsection (c).

(5) In any fiscal year, the City may allocate a sufficient amount from the
Housing Trust Fund to pay for all legally permissible administrative costs of the Fund, including,
without limitation, legal costs, associated with any use of the Housing Trust Fund.

14 (e) Complete Neighborhoods Infrastructure Grant Program. After conferring with the Director of Planning, the Director of the Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and 15 Community Development Department shall design and administer a Complete Neighborhoods 16 17 Infrastructure Grant Program ("Infrastructure Grant Program"). The purpose of the Infrastructure 18 Grant Program is to accelerate the build-out of the public realm infrastructure needed to support 19 increased residential density in the City's neighborhoods. The City may use monies from the 20 Infrastructure Grant Program only for public facilities identified in the Community Facilities 21 District law (Cal. Govt. Code §§ 53311 et seq., as amended), and shall give priority to the use of such monies by residential development project sponsors, community-based organizations, and 22 City departments for public realm improvements associated with proposed residential 23 24 development projects.

1	(f) Bonding Authority. Notwithstanding the limitations set forth in Sections
2	9.107, 9.108, and 9.109 of this Charter, upon recommendation of the Mayor, the Board of
3	Supervisors may authorize the issuance, without limitation, of revenue bonds, lease financing,
4	notes, or other evidences of indebtedness or other obligations ("Debt Obligations"), the proceeds
5	of which are to be used for creating, acquiring, and rehabilitating rental and ownership housing
6	affordable to Households earning up to 120% of the Area Median Income, including, without
7	limitation, the acquisition of land for such purpose. Such Debt Obligations shall be secured by
8	and/or repaid from any available funds pledged or appropriated by Board of Supervisors
9	ordinance for such purpose, which amount may include funds in the Housing Trust Fund
10	allocated under subsection (c). Debt Obligations authorized hereby shall be issued in accordance
11	with the <i>Mayor's Office of Housing Housing and Community Development Department</i> policies,
12	and upon the terms and conditions as the Board of Supervisors shall approve. Funds appropriated
13	to pay debt service on the Debt Obligations in such fiscal year under the terms of this Section
14	<u>16.110(f)</u> shall be set aside in an account for such use until such payment is made.
