1	[Agreement Amendment - Francisco Park Conservancy - Fund Maintenance of Francisco Park - Credit of \$443,000]
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3	Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to amend its agreement
4	with the Francisco Park Conservancy (FPC), to provide FPC a credit of up to \$443,000
5	against its obligation to fund maintenance at Francisco Park over the next five years, to
6	account for a portion of project cost increases generated by PG&E construction
7	requirements.
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9	WHEREAS, A group of Russian Hill neighbors who eventually formed the Francisco
10	Park Conservancy (FPC) advocated for many years that the former Francisco Reservoir
11	should be converted into a public park for San Franciscans and visitors to enjoy; and
12	WHEREAS, The 3.29-acre Francisco Reservoir site was under the jurisdiction of the
13	Public Utilities Commission (PUC) and adjacent to a 0.96-acre open space parcel managed
14	by the Recreation and Park Department (RPD); and
15	WHEREAS, In June 2014 RPD agreed to enter into a transfer agreement with the PUC
16	to purchase the reservoir site for \$9.9 million after the community advocates committed to
17	securing private funding for park construction and maintenance; and
18	WHEREAS, On July 19, 2016, the Board of Supervisors by Ordinance No. 144-16
19	authorized RPD to enter into an agreement with the FPC regarding the funding and
20	stewardship of a new park at the reservoir site, and authorized RPD to accept an in-kind gran
21	of approximately \$25 million in construction services for the park and annual cash grants of
22	approximately \$150,000 to cover park maintenance; and
23	WHEREAS, On July 29, 2016, RPD and FPC entered into this agreement covering the
24	cash and in-kind grants and the working relationship of the parties ("the Agreement"): and
25	WHEREAS, RPD and FPC subsequently finalized the precise amount of annual

support for staffing and materials and supplies at \$199,263 for Fiscal Year 22-23 and rising to approximately \$242,434 in Fiscal Year 27-28 based on an estimated 4% annual increases in salary expenses; and

WHEREAS, FPC's contractors began construction on the park in 2019 and during park construction PG&E imposed requirements on the project that resulted in unexpected costs of approximately \$1,154,692; and

WHEREAS, After subtracting the \$269,100 that FPC owed RPD in project management fees, leaving an outstanding amount of \$885,592, the partners agreed to seek other City funds to cover some part of this overage and to split whatever remains after any additional funding is secured, with each side committing to up to \$443,000 each if no additional funding is secured; and

WHEREAS, RPD plans to handle its portion of this commitment by performing park maintenance at its own cost, and providing FPC with a credit of up to \$100,000 per year for four years and \$43,000 in the fifth year, until RPD's total share of the remaining outstanding amounts is accounted for; and

WHEREAS, The partners have jointly prepared a draft amendment to the Agreement that memorializes this proposal ("the Amendment"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 220693; and

WHEREAS, The Amendment does not affect the partners' joint commitment to maintain the park at the highest possible standard for many years to come as set forth in the original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, In approving the Amendment, the Board of Supervisors is not committing itself at this time to fund the outstanding amount; any future appropriations for the project shall be at the discretion of the Board of Supervisors and subject to the City's budgetary process;

1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the RPD to enter into the
2	Amendment substantially in the form set forth in the Board File; and, be it
3	FURTHER RESOLVED, That within 30 days of the Amendment being fully-executed by
4	all parties, the RPD shall provide the final Amendment to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion
5	into the official file.
