Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 10.100-
185, to read as follows:
SEC. 10.100-185. POLICE VEHICLE THEFT CRIMES FUND.
(a) Imposition of Fee. Pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 9250.14, the City and
County of San Francisco authorizes the imposition of a fee of \$2 to be paid at the time of registration
or renewal of registration of every vehicle registered to an address within the City except those
expressly exempted under State law.
(b) <b>Establishment of Fund.</b> The Police Vehicle Theft Crimes Fund is established as a
category six fund to receive money which reflects collected under the California Department of
Motor Vehicles' \$42 surcharge on vehicles registered to a San Francisco address pursuant to
California Vehicle Code Section 9250.14.
(bc) Use of Fund. The <u>Chief of Police shall use monies in the</u> fund shall be used
exclusively for deterring, investigating or prosecuting vehicle theft crimes, and consistent with

1 any state guidelines for their use. No costs which may be incurred by any City department in 2 administering this fund shall be recovered therefrom.

3 (ed) **Exceptions to Fund Category.** The Chief of Police may only authorize expenditures from the fund following acceptance of monies by the Police Commission. The 4 5 balance remaining in this fund after January 1, 2000, December 31, 1995, shall be returned to the 6 State Controller for deposit in the Motor Vehicle account in the State Transportation Fund.

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8 Section 2. Effective Date and Operative Date. This ordinance shall become effective 9 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, 10 or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. This ordinance shall 11 12 not become operative until six months from the date that the Chief of Police certifies in writing 13 to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors that the Department has complied with the submission requirement set forth in California Vehicle Code Section 9250.14. 14

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16 Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors 17 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, 18 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment 19 20 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under 21 /// /// 22 23 /// /// 24
