WHEREAS, The California Victim Compensation Board provides financial support and services to crime victims and exonerees; and

WHEREAS, Providing this support increases community safety, improves trust between law enforcement and victims and also reduces a victim's urge to retaliate; and

WHEREAS, If you are a crime survivor, California law provides you the ability to seek financial compensation and services through the Victim Compensation Board; and

WHEREAS, The Victim Compensation Board also funds trauma counseling, funeral expenses, and medical expenses; and

WHEREAS, This important service is underfunded and governed by language that has prevented many crime survivors from being able to access funds or receive the help needed to recover; and

WHEREAS, The application process for accessing these services can be lengthy and burdensome; and

WHEREAS, California State Senate Bill No. (SB) 993 improves access to support and services for survivors and exonerees and increases the financial support a crime survivor can receive; and

WHEREAS, SB 993 would increase the compensation cap, improve access to financial assistance for mental health services and expand access to lost income or support services

WHEREAS, SB 993 would allow community organizations to provide direct cash assistance to violent crime survivors with minimal administrative burden; and

WHEREAS, The bill would streamline the claims process for Victim Compensation Board benefits; and

WHEREAS, SB 993 would remove barriers that contribute to denials and racial disparities in Victim Compensation Board claim awards, including correctional supervision disqualification, denials related to law enforcement cooperation, discretionary denials that blame the victim for their own victimization; and

WHEREAS, Improve support for exonerees, including compensation for time spent on parole or probation and for attorney's fees associated with overturning a conviction or securing a pardon; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors shall support California State Senate Bill No. 993 and join Senator Nancy Skinner, Californians for Safety and Justice, Crime Survivors for Safety and Justice, After Innocence and others to support the passage of this bill; and, be it
