Resolution urging Governor Gavin Newsom, the California Community College Board of Governors, and Chancellor Eloy Ortiz Oakley to exempt City College of San Francisco from the State Funding Formula and recognize its community college status.

WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco ("City College") was established in 1935 and is an essential part of San Francisco, providing affordable or free workforce training and higher education to all San Franciscans; and

WHEREAS, City College has consistently offered generations of San Francisco residents, especially those from low-income households, immigrant communities, and communities of color pathways to a living wage, lifelong learning, and advanced college degrees; and

WHEREAS, Since the cost of attending California's public four-year universities has become so expensive, more local low-income and middle-income families and students rely on City College and the high quality, affordable higher education, second-career training, and workforce development it provides during these tough times, especially throughout the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, In addition to offering diverse degree programs and classes, City College is truly a community college, providing mental health and wellness programs, career fairs and training seminars, lifelong learning opportunities, vocational education, English as a Second Language courses, and many resources for all our diverse community needs; and

WHEREAS, City College has enjoyed strong support for its community education model from San Francisco residents, who have consistently passed funding measures to support City College, including making City College free for all San Francisco residents; and

WHEREAS, Despite this support and California having the fifth largest economy in the world, we continue to face attacks on public education funding, which perpetuates a persistent cycle of poverty in certain communities, despite the state's immense wealth; and

WHEREAS, Chronic underfunding of our communities' educational needs hits City

College especially hard, forcing cuts of vital programs and offerings, elimination of educational opportunity, lowering enrollment, and leaving students struggling to complete their educational goals; and

WHEREAS, The existing community colleges' state funding formula, also known as the Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF), focuses on full-time enrollment numbers and does not recognize the critical role that City College plays in the San Francisco community and consequently does not provided City College with the adequate funds to maintain its educational facilities and academic programs, which will be aggravated when the current "Hold Harmless" stability funding expires in Fiscal Year 2023-2024; and

WHEREAS, This inadequate funding is further exacerbated by local budgetary actions downsizing City College and cost cutting measures including unnecessary layoffs and deeper cuts to course offerings, negatively impacting the opportunity to higher education and job training for San Francisco residents; and

WHEREAS, In addition, the SCFF does not adequately account for cost of living expenses, exacerbating inequity in education access for students of color, and those from immigrant and low-income households in high cost areas such as the San Francisco Bay Area; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Governor Gavin Newsom, the California Community College Board of Governors, and Chancellor Eloy Ortiz Oakley to exempt City College of San Francisco from California's State Funding Formula; and, be it
