RE: File 220631 – Charter amendment to pass the Affordable Housing Production Act

Dear Ms. Calvillo,

Should the proposed Charter amendment and initiative be approved by the voters, in my opinion, it would minimally impact the cost of government.

The proposed Charter Amendment would provide for accelerated review and approval of eligible 100% affordable housing projects, educator housing projects, and market-rate projects that provide significant increased affordability. The Planning Department would provide ministerial review for these projects instead of certain approvals, which are currently required, by the Planning Commission, Historic Preservation Commission, Arts commission, Boards of Supervisors, and Board of Appeals.

To the extent that this legislation shortens the approval process, The City's affordable housing projects could see cost savings due to shorter development and construction timelines on project costs. To the extent the legislation results in an increase in affordable versus market rate housing production, either at lower assessed values or as tax-exempt properties, it could result in a future loss of property tax revenues. We consider it likely that both of these impacts will be modest given likely ranges of projects that would be eligible for the measure's accelerated review.

The Legislation also requires sponsors of projects to pay prevailing wages during construction and use a skilled and trained workforce on Educator Housing Project and Increased Affordability Projects. This would require the City to adopt an ordinance to allow the Office of Labor Standards Enforcement to enforce these requirements.
