1	[Advanced Written Determination Regarding Statement of Incompatible Activities - Small Business Commission - Tiffany Carter]
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3	Motion finding that Tiffany Carter's proposal to apply for grants administered by the
4	Office of Economic and Workforce Development ("OEWD") and to seek assistance
5	from OEWD relating to the growth of the restaurant she owns are not incompatible with
6	the Statement of Incompatible Activities of the Small Business Commission, of which
7	she is a member.
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9	WHEREAS, Tiffany Carter is a member of the Small Business Commission ("SBC"),
10	appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and the owner of restaurant named Boug Cali, which
11	generates less than \$1 million in annual revenue; and
12	WHEREAS, Members of the Small Business Commission are subject to a Statement of
13	Incompatible Activities ("SIA") that guides employees of the Office of Economic and Workforce
14	Development ("OEWD") and members of the SBC about the kinds of activities that are
15	incompatible with their public duties and therefore prohibited; and
16	WHEREAS, Section 3.218 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code
17	authorizes City employees and officers to seek an Advance Written Determination ("AWD")
18	from their employer or appointing officer that a proposed activity is or is not incompatible with
19	the governing SIA; and
20	WHEREAS, An AWD that a proposed activity is not incompatible with the applicable
21	SIA provides the requestor with immunity from any subsequent enforcement action for
22	violation of the SIA if the material facts are as presented in the requestor's written submission;
23	and
24	WHEREAS, Carter submitted a request for an AWD confirming that the following
25	activities are not incompatible under the SBC's SIA: 1) applying for OEWD grants to support

1 her restaurant, Boug Cali, and 2) seeking assistance from OEWD to identify a new location for 2 her restaurant ("Proposed Activities"); Carter's request is on file with the Clerk of the Board of 3 Supervisors in Board File No. \_\_\_\_\_; and WHEREAS, Notwithstanding this prohibition, Carter's proposed activities are not 4 5 incompatible with the SBC's SIA because the City and County aspires to a diversity of 6 representation on its Boards and Commissions, particularly encouraging women and 7 members of the BIPOC, Immigrant, LGBTQ+, Reentry and other underrepresented 8 communities to serve on their own time; and 9 WHEREAS, BIPOC, Immigrant, LGBTQ+, Reentry and other underrepresented communities also experience significant barriers to accessing small business financial and 10 11 technical support, as well as pre-development, lease, capital tenant improvement and 12 acquisition funding, and having to choose between equitable access to small business grants, 13 loans or other forms of public assistance can be a disincentive to authentic and diverse 14 representation on the Small Business Commission; and 15 WHEREAS, Small business owners in the restaurant industry have very small margins, 16 and without significant outside investment from private investors, are unable to afford high 17 commercial rents, required upgrades to bring restaurant spaces up to code, or even broker 18 services to help locate viable space; and WHEREAS, Tiffany Carter's small business does not generate enough revenue 19 20 currently to qualify her to pay gross receipts tax; now, therefore, be it 21 MOVED, That based on the information submitted, the Board of Supervisors finds that the Proposed Activities are not incompatible with the SIA of the SBC, subject to the following 22 23 conditions: 24 25

3	Cali begins to generate over \$1 million in revenue annually; and
4	The Board of Supervisors may hold a hearing to re-evaluate this AWD approval
5	at any point.
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
