8	WHEREAS, United Playaz (UP) is a multicultural and intergenerational violence
9	prevention and youth development organization located in the South of Market (SOMA) that
10	has been serving San Francisco's youth since 1994; and
11	WHEREAS, UP moved to SOMA in 2005 and became one of the first community
12	based organizations to purchase a property in SOMA; and
13	WHEREAS, UP has grown significantly over the last 25 years, starting with a budget of
14 15	\$100,000 to the current \$3,000,000 budget, and going from one employee to nineteen
16	employees with ⅓ of current program staff consisting of former program participants; and
17	WHEREAS, UP has been a consistent partner and supporter of Bessie Carmichael, a
18	pre-K-8 school located in SOMA, helping to acquire resources such as an additional assistant
19	principal, more social workers, and more funding for key programs; and
20	WHEREAS, UP's programs provide youth with adult support, academic enrichment,
21	and leadership skills to prevent them from entering or re-entering the justice system by
22	reframing their perceptions, attitudes and beliefs about the future and emphasizing the
23	
24	positive effect they can have on their community, helping them to gain the knowledge and
25	empowerment needed to tackle daily exposure to social and cultural pressures; and

1	WHEREAS, UP has a presence at 7 high schools in San Francisco, providing in-school		
2	violence prevention and support and helping youth develop leadership skills through		
3	participation in violence prevention programming; and		
4	WHEREAS, UP's after-school programs provide a safe haven for elementary and		
5	middle school youth, providing them with access to homework help, life skills workshops, field		
6	trips throughout the year, and other recreational activities; and		
7	WHEREAS, UP provides year-round individual case management services to youth		
8	geared towards disrupting cycles of destructive behavior, improving the overall health of		
10	youth participants by increasing their knowledge and access to ancillary services through a		
11	well-established network of partners and referrals; and		
12	WHEREAS, UP provides workforce training, academic assistance with the General		
13	Educational Development test (GED) and High School Equivalency exam (HSE), as well as		
14	college enrollment services and referrals to vocational training and other employment		
15	programs, to ensure that program participants become self-sufficient adults; and		
16 17	WHEREAS, UP provides support to citywide crisis response teams, as well as street		
18	level outreach to prevent and reduce violent activities with staff members on call 24 hours a		
19	day; and		
20	WHEREAS, UP has held an annual gun buyback day for the last ten years, taking 265		
21	guns off the street in December of 2021 alone; now, therefore, be it		
22	RESOLVED, That there shall be an honorary naming of "United Playaz Way" in		
23	recognition of the valued contributions to the South of Market and the Youth of San Francisco;
