3	Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Technology to accept an in-kind
4	gift of Internet Access Service valued at \$173,400 from Monkeybrains.net for the period
5	of March 1, 2020, through December 31, 2022.

7	WHEREAS, Monkeybrains.net is a local San Francisco based Internet Service Provider
8	that has been providing high quality internet service to San Francisco residents and
9	businesses since 1998; and
10	WHEREAS, Quality, high speed internet access is necessary to provide equitable City
11	services, educational resources, employment opportunities and healthcare to San Francisco's
12	underserved communities; and
13	WHEREAS, By offering free high speed internet service to residents of affordable
14	housing Monkeybrains.net has made an unequaled and valued contribution in excess of \$1
15	million dollars to closing the digital divide; and
16	WHEREAS, In 2017 Monkeybrains received grant funding through the California
17	Advanced Services Fund Broadband Public Housing Account to provide internet service to
18	low income families and Monkeybrains began providing free internet service to San Francisco
19	affordable housing residents; and
20	WHEREAS, When the grant funding became unavailable for affordable housing
21	projects, Monkeybrains continued to provide the internet service to the residents at no cost;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, DT has built a fiber ring to affordable housing properties for their use and
24	development; and

1	WHEREAS, Monkeybrains makes free Internet Access Service available to over 6,800
2	units of affordable housing, and 1,090 shelter and supportive housing beds and has
3	committed to provide this internet service to residents at no cost through December 2022; and
4	WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, the Mayor of San Francisco declared a local health
5	emergency regarding COVID-19 and student, seniors, and underserved residents required
6	internet service during the pandemic; a copy of said Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the
7	Board of Supervisors in File No. 200228, and is incorporated herein by reference; and
8	WHEREAS, Monkeybrains assisted the Department of Technology (DT) by providing
9	internet service to COVID isolation facilities, tent sites for the unhoused, testing stations, and
10	mass vaccination sites; and
11	WHEREAS, Monkeybrains and DT have agreed to continue to interconnect their
12	networks to ensure that there is no interruption of service to affordable housing residents in
13	the buildings served as of August 31, 2021; and
14	WHEREAS, The internet service requested by DT is valued at a total of \$173,400; and
15	WHEREAS, The gifts do not require amendments to the Annual Salary Ordinance;

17	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors retroactively approves the in-kind gift
18	valued at \$173,400 and hereby authorizes, through the Department of Technology to accept

Re: Internet Service Donation

Dear Ms. Gerull:

We have enjoyed working with the Department of Technology (DT) to help the department respond to the COVID 19 crisis and collaborating to ensure residents of affordable housing receive free internet access through the Fiber to Housing program. As part of the COVID 19 response, Monkeybrains.net contributed internet access to the Department of Technology to serve COVID isolation facilities, tent sites for the unhoused, shelters, testing stations, community hubs and mass vaccination sites. As part of the Fiber to Housing project Monkeybrains.net contributed free internet access to the residents of affordable housing. We understand that DT wishes to provide these services directly over time. In order to ensure continuity of service, Monkeybrains.net will look forward remaining keeping our network interconnected with DT.

We have agreed to a valuation of \$173,400 for the donation of free internet access to the Department of Technology to support its COVID 19 response efforts. This includes the value of the service we have provided to these 34 sites since March 2020, plus a commitment to continue this service through December 2022 for a total of 34 months. The monthly cost is based on the monthly charge Monkeybrains.net charges its customers for its Classic Business service, \$150 per month.

We have agreed to the valuation of \$6,240,900 for the donation of free internet access to residents of affordable housing. This includes the value of the internet access we have contributed to date, plus a commitment to continue this service through December 2022. This estimate has two components, the cost of providing ongoing internet access, maintenance and

customer service and the cost of equipment and labor to install this equipment. The internet service is based on providing service at a cost of \$25 per unit per month for each month worth of service thus far and the maintenance of this service to the existing 7042 units through December 2022.

We would like to express our special thanks to Joseph John and his team in the Department of technology public safety division who we worked closely. We would also like to acknowledge the key personnel on the monkeybrains.net side who made this project possible: Mason Carroll was the leader of this project. Preston Rhea developed the program. James Trieu, Caleb Dubois and Carlos Alcantar provided engineering support. Mark Landry and Daniel Woodbury were our field technicians.

Compliance with Gift Regulations and Increasing Transparency in City Department Relationships with Non-City Organizations

September 24, 2020

It is imperative that City business is conducted in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations and with the utmost integrity. Nothing is more important than the trust the public has in its government. One of the foundations of this trust is the principle that government business is conducted for the public benefit and that government workers serve that public interest.

Earlier this year, when I learned the Director of Public Works had been indicted on federal charges, I asked the City Attorney and the Controller to design and conduct a thorough and independent review of any implicated City contracts or other decisions, investigate any suspected violations of the law or City guidelines, and develop recommendations on how to protect the integrity of City processes and decisions. I also issued Executive Directive No. 20-01 directing all City employees and departments to cooperate with any requests made by the City Attorney and the Controller and proactively share information that they believe could be helpful to this investigation.

The Controller has released a report detailing findings and recommendations regarding gifts to City departments through non-city organizations. Many of your departments have relationships with non-city organizations, including "Friends of Organizations." These partnerships can help provide philanthropic support for City efforts, and community priorities. However, the opportunities these relationships create cannot be at the expense of our primary role as public employees, which is to conduct government business for the public benefit.

The Controller's report makes clear that uniform and stricter standards must be applied to City departments' relationships with these organizations in order to increase transparency and accountability, and prevent a perceived or actual risk of a "pay-to-play" relationship.

Directives:

Through this Executive Directive, I hereby direct:

1. All Departments Heads shall comply with the City's behested payment reporting requirements, which currently apply only to City elected officials and members of boards and commissions, contained in Article III, Chapter 6 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code. This includes the filing of behested payment forms (Form SFEC-3610(b)). Departments should track and retain this information and begin filing behested payment forms as soon as the Ethics Commission makes that form available for electronic filing by Department Heads.

- 2. All City departments shall formalize through a memorandum of understanding any relationship the department has with a non-City organization that receives donations on behalf of the department, where such agreements are not already in place. These memoranda of understanding shall be prepared in consultation with the Office of the City Attorney and the Controller. In preparing these memoranda of understanding departments shall work with the City Attorney and Controller to include terms and requirements which ensure transparency, accountability, and adherence to City laws. These memoranda of understanding shall be approved by the City Attorney, Controller, and if applicable the department's board or commission, and posted on the department's website.
- 3. All departments shall ensure compliance with Administrative Code, Section 10.100-305 or other applicable sections of Administrative Code Chapter 10, Article XIII, which sets forth the requirements for accepting and reporting certain gifts to departments. In all required disclosures under the Administrative Code, departments shall state whether the gift is used for employee recognition or appreciation, and where required, seek advance acceptance from the Board of Supervisors.
- 4. In each department's annual reports submitted every July under Administrative Code section 10.100-305(c), the department shall certify that all gifts received by the department in the previous fiscal year were approved by the Board of Supervisors, if required under the Administrative Code, and timely reported.

This Executive Directive will take effect immediately, and will remain in place until rescinded by future written communication.

Services - Monkeybrains.net- Valued at \$173,400

The current resolution is retroactive because the Department of Technology originally began accepting the donation of Internet Access services in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. As part of its COVID-19 pandemic response, the Department of Technology needed to provide Internet connectivity quickly to a variety of sites, such as, isolation facilities, tent sites for the unhoused, testing stations, and mass vaccination sites. We have included a copy of the Mayor's February 25, 2020, declaration of a local health emergency regarding COVID-19. These sites often provided unique challenges to establish connectivity. Monkeybrains' wireless technology and nimble organization were able to assist rapidly in establishing these connections.
