Demand for Information

- Hotline received 1-2 calls per minute as soon as we created it
- Virtual town hall was attended by hundreds
- Continue to receive requests for information about transmission, prevention, and vaccination

Causes on genital and/or anal area, face, hands/feet, and other areas of the body

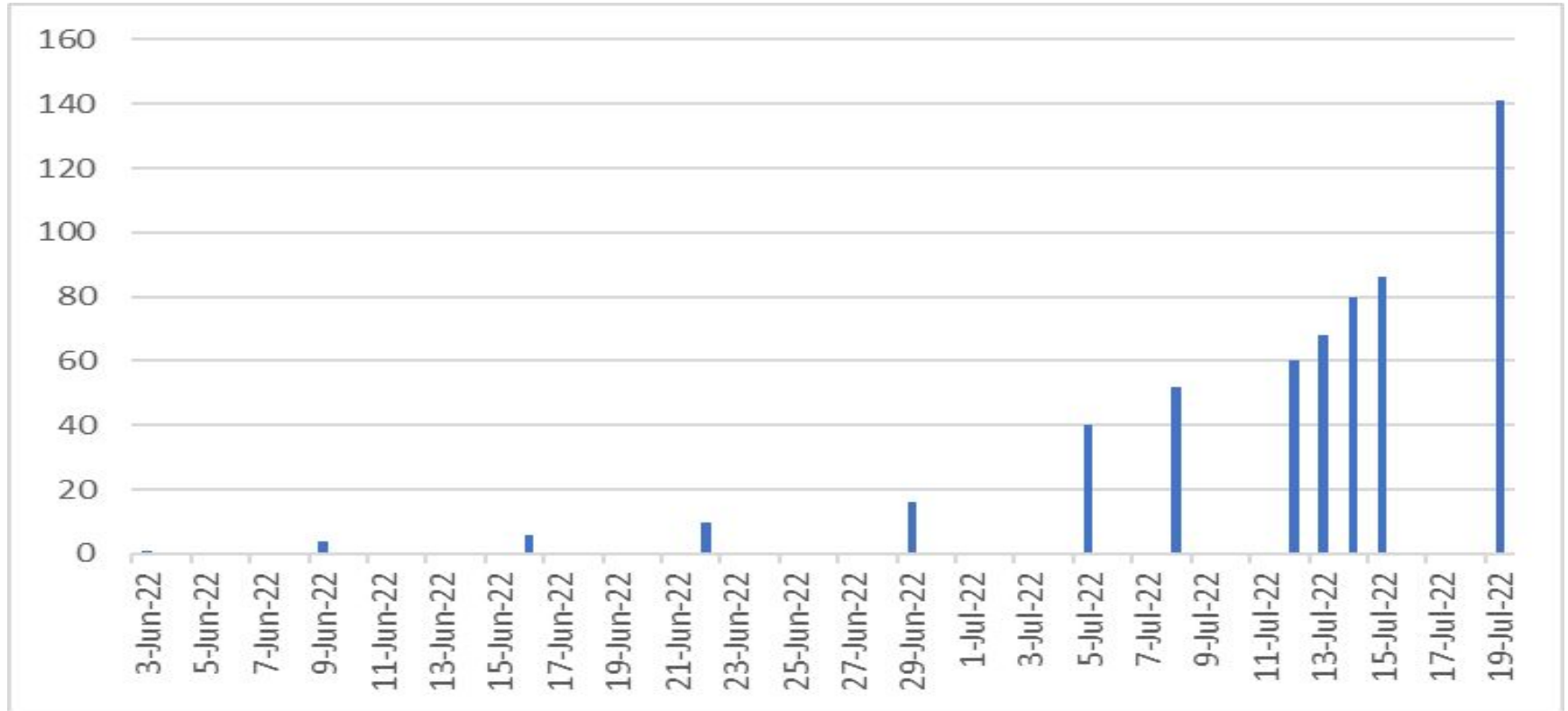
Most cases among gay and bi men

Mostly spread by skin-to-skin contact

Growth of MPX Cases in San Francisco



SFAF Testing and Diagnosis as of 7/20/2022

- Tested 52 people since 6/17/22:
 - 20 positive
 - 6 negative
 - 26 pending
- Demographics of those tested
 - 49% BIPOC: 18% Latinx, 14% API, 6% Black
 - 98% men
 - Age range is 23-66
- Demographics of those who tested positive for MPX
 - 65% BIPOC: 30% Latinx, 25% API, 5% Black

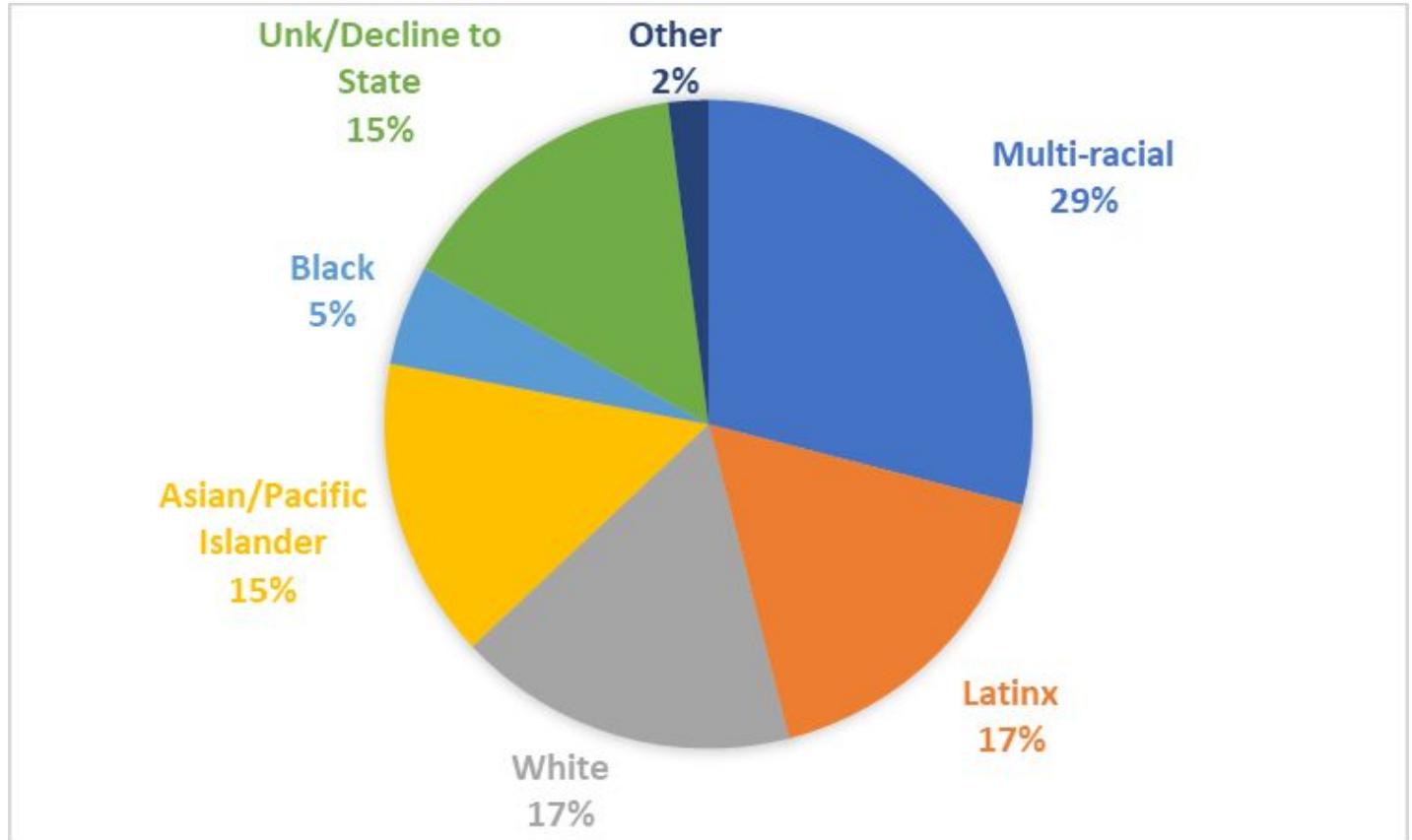
Vaccinations at SFAF as of 7/20/2022

- Vaccinated 761 people
 - Including 460 people vaccinated at Sunday event at Strut
- Have 127 vaccine doses on hand
- Over 4,800 people on our wait list
- Actively moving through our wait list and making appointments
- Wait list is growing faster than we are receiving vaccines

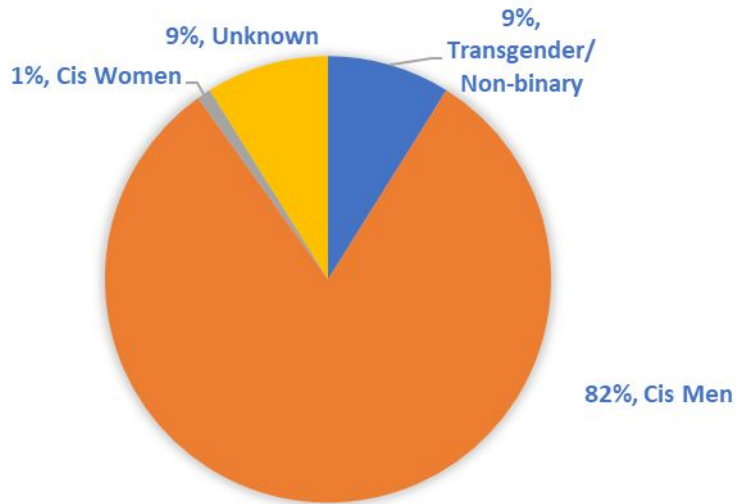
SFAF Vaccination Overview

- We are reaching people at high risk:
 - Documented exposures, especially from Pride parties
 - Predominately gay/bi/trans men and trans women
 - Many people on our waitlist are also trying to access vaccines at SFGH, City Clinic, and Steamworks
- Racial equity:
 - Majority of people diagnosed and vaccinated are BIPOC individuals
- Trusted, culturally competent provider for gay/bi men's sexual health

SFAF Vaccine Demographics



- Over 80% are gay/bi cisgender men
- Nine percent transgender or non-binary
- 65% between 25-44 years old

SFDPH Partnership

- Proud to partner with SFDPH
- Aligned with equity approaches
- Expanded eligibility criteria is more reflective of need in the community
- Adding staff to support SFAF's hotline to expand citywide

SFAF Recommendations and Requests

- VACCINES!
 - 200/week for appointments and targeted events
 - 1000 for 2-4 large events for priority communities
- Equity in outreach and access to vaccines
 - Access for trans/non-binary individuals
 - Sex workers, queer nightlife staff, other occupational exposures
- Community dashboard with demographics on testing, diagnosis, and vaccinations
- Community-led, sex positive, accurate messaging on prevention and exposures
