1	[Urging Congress to Provide Relief to Restaurants and the State of California to Allow Outdoor Dining As Soon As Possible]
3	Resolution urging the United States Congress to provide immediate cash relief to
4	restaurants and urging the State of California to allow outdoor dining as soon as the
5	latest available medical data and expertise deem it safe to do so.

7	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco, the State of California, and the
8	United States of America have declared states of emergency in response to the COVID-19
9	pandemic, which has claimed the lives of over 300,000 Americans and caused illness in more
10	than 16 million more; and
11	WHEREAS, On December 4, 2020, due to an alarming increase in COVID-19 cases,
12	test positivity rates, and hospitalizations, the City joined Bay Area counties in preemptively
13	adopting the State's Regional Stay at Home Order, which came into effect on December 6,
14	2020, and, among other services and facilities, mandated closures of outdoor recreation
15	centers; outdoor museums, zoos, and aquariums; outdoor and indoor personal care services;
16	and outdoor dining; and
17	WHEREAS, As of December 14, 2020, the City has counted 18,645 positive cases of
18	and 167 deaths due to COVID-19; and
19	WHEREAS, The measures required to slow the spread of COVID-19 and minimize the
20	loss of life have also resulted in severe economic impacts for the City's small business sector,
21	with the restaurant industry, which employs 60,000 workers in San Francisco, among the
22	hardest hit; and
23	WHEREAS, In addition to the limited grants the City is able to provide and previous
24	federal efforts, including the Paycheck Protection Program, restaurants need an infusion of

1	funding in the form of immediate cash subsidies, and the federal government is in a unique
2	position to provide this much-needed assistance; and
3	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors has previously passed a
4	resolution urging the United States Congress to pass the Real Economic Support that
5	Acknowledges Unique Restaurant Assistance Needed to Survive Act, or RESTAURANTS Act
6	to support the nation's struggling restaurants; and
7	WHEREAS, The Congress has heretofore failed to pass such legislation, despite its
8	October 1, 2020, passage in the House of Representatives and continuous pleas from
9	restaurant owners and workers who require immediate and long-term assistance to continue
10	operating; and
11	WHEREAS, In the absence of immediate relief from the federal government, San
12	Francisco restaurants will continue to be forced to furlough or lay off their workers, further
13	exacerbating the ruinous economic impacts of this pandemic, which will be ameliorated only
14	upon the nation's getting COVID-19 under control; now, therefore, be it
15	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Congress to pass an emergency
16	funding bill that provides immediate cash relief to our restaurants and restaurant workers; and
17	be it
18	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the State to allow
19	outdoor dining as soon as the latest available medical data and expertise deem it safe to do
20	so; and, be it
21	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board
22	to transmit copies of this Resolution to Speaker Nancy Pelosi, Congresswoman Jackie Speier
23	Senators Dianne Feinstein and Kamala Harris, Governor Gavin Newsom, and Dr. Tomás

Aragón.

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
