EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Legislative Objectives

<u>File 10-1369</u>: Hearing to consider the findings of the Budget and Legislative Analyst's audit of the City's child care and early child education programs. The hearing will address recommendations of the audit and consider responses from the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, the Human Services Agency, First 5 San Francisco, and the Department of Public Health.

Fiscal Impact

In FY 2009-10, the Human Services Agency, the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, and First 5 San Francisco spent \$63.3 million for early care and education programs. Of this amount, \$30. 2 million were State and Federal funds and \$33.1 million were City funds, including the General Fund, Children's Fund, and Public Education and Enrichment Fund. The Budget and Legislative Analyst identified at least \$995,000 in unexpended General Fund, Children's Fund, and Public Education Enrichment Fund monies because early care and education programs were not fully utilized in FY 2009-10. This represents an estimated 100 subsidized child care slots.

Key Points

In response to a motion adopted by the Board of Supervisors in August 2010 (Motion No. 10-125), the Budget and Legislative Analyst conducted a performance audit of San Francisco's Early Care and Education Programs. The scope of the performance audit included (1) early care and education program coordination and oversight by the three departments primarily responsible for these programs - the Human Services Agency, the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, and First 5 San Francisco; and (2) health and mental health consultation services provided by the Department of Public Health to early care and education programs.

Funds and programs for early care and education are divided among the Human Services Agency, the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, and First 5 San Francisco. Each of these departments has different mandates, procedures, and governance structures for providing early care and education programs. These three departments have collaborated on joint funding of early care and education programs and developed interdepartmental committees to plan for and monitor these programs. While this collaboration has allowed the three departments to leverage funding and provide a broader array of early care and education programs, the joint funding and interdepartmental committees are voluntary and do not ensure ongoing collaboration.

The current system of early care and education, administered by the Human Services Agency, the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, and First 5 San Francisco has limitations. These limitations include different requirements for and monitoring of child care providers, insufficient child care capacity in several lower income neighborhoods, and fewer health and mental health consultation services in some lower income neighborhoods.

The Budget and Legislative Analyst submitted the *Performance Audit of San Francisco's Early Care and Education Programs* to the Board of Supervisors on November 17, 2010. The Executive Director of the Human Services Agency, the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, and the Director of First 5 San Francisco provided a written response which was attached to the performance audit report.
