| 17 | spirit of Pacifica Radio's unique experiment in listener-supported-employee run radio; and, |
| 18 | WHEREAS, surrounding KPFA are many entities that must better coordinate their |
| 19 | efforts to keep this station on the air and in better financial footing. These entities include the |
| 20 | Pacifica Radio board, KPFA's Local Board, the staff union leadership of CWA Local 9415, |
| 21 | listener representatives and media organizations; now, therefore, be it, |
| 22 | DESCLIVED. That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Desifies Dadio to |
| 23 | RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Pacifica Radio to |
| 24 | seek mediation with the station union, the local station board, and listener representatives to |

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negotiate in a transparent manner a collective solution that will be fair and acceptable to all, bringing the current *Morning Show* crisis to a favorable conclusion, and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges these entities to continue this effort to stabilize the financial standing of the station and strengthen the stations efforts to bring grassroots commercial free programming to the Bay Area and beyond.
