I have been working with homeless, veterans, and the formerly incarcerated all of my professional life. I have written and received veterans grants with re-entry strategies—using both innovative workforce solutions to place workers, as well as addressing the lack of opportunities for homeless, veterans, and the formerly incarcerated by creating the jobs directly—As part of a team I helped start and run market-based social businesses whose sole purpose is to employ those least able to get into the workforce and provide a solid career ladder.

I have served on 3 WIB Boards as well as their advisory boards and I have a strong understanding of serving in this capacity representing homeless, veterans, and other underserved populations.

For over 15 years I have been working to create innovative employment solutions, most notably creating social purpose businesses that bring jobs, training and supportive services to the disenfranchised. Many of these have been models of what social enterprise can be: Market driven businesses that hire people others won't, that provide training for people ready to change their lives and businesses that provide value to their customers. One example was a bakery that continues to work with many of Americas leading food retailers and provides great products for the customers who bought our desserts and confections. The Workforce Investment Community Advisory Committee shall consist of 7 members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint four (4) members to the Committee. The Transitional Youth Task Force shall appoint one (1) member to the Committee; the Local Homeless Coordinating Board shall appoint one (1) member to the Committee; the San Francisco Safe Communities Re-Entry Council shall appoint one (1) member to the Committee. All Committee members must be staff and/or Board members of 501c3 organizations.

All Committee members will be appointed to serve for a two year term, and all Committee members and/or the organizations they represent will serve for no more than two (2) consecutive terms. The terms are to be staggered. Therefore, at the first meeting of the Committee, the members will draw lots to determine which three (3) members will serve for one (1) year.

The Committee shall be convened to serve in an advisory capacity to the Workforce Investment San Francisco (WISF). This committee shall include members representing workforce development service providers and other community-based organizations serving low-income San Francisco residents and those with barriers to employment. The Committee shall advise the WISF on workforce system priorities, client needs and services.
