

1 [Accept and Expend Grant – Sudden Oak Death - \$896]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health to accept and**  
4 **expend retroactively a grant (Agreement #10-0511) from the California Department of**  
5 **Food and Agriculture in the amount of \$896 to fund the project “Sudden Oak Death” for**  
6 **the period of July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011.**

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8 WHEREAS, The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) awarded DPH  
9 funding for the Sudden Oak Death Project in the amount of \$896, for the period of July 1,  
10 2010 through June 30, 2011; and,

11 WHEREAS, This funding will allow DPH to contain the spread of Sudden Oak Death;  
12 and,

13 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, CDFA requires the City to  
14 enter into an agreement (the “Agreement”), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the  
15 Board of Supervisors in File No.101570; which is hereby declared to be a part of this  
16 resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

17 WHEREAS, An ASO amendment is not required as the grant partially reimburses DPH  
18 for two existing positions, one Agricultural Inspector (Job Class #3450) at .005 FTE and one  
19 Junior Administrative Analyst (Job Class #1820) at 0.001 FTE, for the period of July 1, 2010  
20 through June 30,2011; and,

21 WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DPH did not  
22 receive notification of the award until November 10, 2010 for a project start date of July 1,  
23 2010; and,

24 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs in the amount of  
25 \$169; and, now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend a grant retroactively  
2 in the amount of \$896 from the CDFA; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend the  
4 grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the positions  
6 funded under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when  
7 the agreement expires; and, be it

8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
9 agreement on behalf of the City.
