Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department to retroactively accept and expend a gift of \$171,753 from the San Francisco Parks Trust to support various Recreation and Park Department operations.

WHEREAS, Since 1971 the San Francisco Parks Trust, a non-profit organization, has been a partner of, fiscal sponsor to and philanthropic benefactor of the Recreation and Park Department, supporting San Francisco’s parks, open spaces, and recreation facilities; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Parks Trust acts as a fiscal agent for the Recreation and Park Department, managing approximately 50 small gift funds on the department’s behalf; and,

WHEREAS, In 2009 – 2010 the San Francisco Parks Trust contributed \$171,753 to the Recreation and Park Department from these gift funds to help sustain a wide variety of activities at the department including \$82,560 to support the commemorative park bench program, \$67,460 to support recreation programming and activities such as Scare Grove and Playday on the Green, \$9,800 to support the nursery in Golden Gate Park, \$8,690 to support the volunteer program, and \$3,243 to support Camp Mather; and,

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission recommends that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors accept and expend retroactively the gift in the amount of \$171,753; and,

WHEREAS, The City recognizes the generosity of the San Francisco Parks Trust with sincere appreciation; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the Gift and authorizes the
2 Recreation and Park Department General Manager to retroactively accept and expend the
3 Gift valued at \$171,753 from the San Francisco Park Trust to support various Recreation and
4 Park operations in Fiscal Year 2009-2010.
