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## Drug, Set, and Setting (Norman Zinberg)

#### Drug Use and Overdose is impacted by

- Drug: the frequency of use, route of administration, potency of drug, and effect of the drug
- Set: the mindset and characteristics of the people using the drug
- Setting: the social, environmental, and structural influences on drug use practices

## Harm reduction services: Drug

- Safe drug supply
  - Provide access to uncontaminated drugs in well delineated doses and formulations
    - Selective serotonin reuptake inhibitor
    - Methadone
    - Buprenorphine
    - Diacetylmorphine
    - Psilocybin
- Overdose education and naloxone distribution
- Drug Testing
  - Learning what is contained in substances
    - FTIR and Mass Spec machines
    - Fentanyl test strips
    - Benzodiazepine test strips
- Safe equipment
  - Providing sterile equipment for preparation and ingestion of drugs
    - Syringes, pipes, cookers, water

### Harm reduction services: Set

- Gender
- Race/ethnicity
- Homelessness
- Youth
- People involved in sex work
- Gay and bisexual men

## Harm reduction services: Setting

- Safe consumption sites
  - Sanctioned safe consumption sites
  - Overdose prevention services
  - Unsanctioned safe consumption sites
- Drop-in sites
- Supportive housing and single residency hotels

- Effectiveness
- Adoption
- Implementation
- Maintenance

## Status of Overdose Prevention Services in San Francisco

#### Recommendations

- Existing harm reduction services have prevented more overdose deaths.
- We know how to reduce overdoses. We simply need to increase RE-AIM of existing harm reduction services.
- Maintain Syringe Access Services Programs
- Expand naloxone more in African American communities and implement naloxone programs like Brave Buttons in supportive housing and SROs
- Increase access to medically assisted treatment, increase modalities (including residential treatment), and bolster contingency management
- Maintain fentanyl and benzodiazepine test strips
- Fully implement drug checking and increase venues that provide this service
- Implement overdose prevention services in a variety of settings in highly impacted neighborhoods.
- Provide more drop-in services in many neighborhoods.
