### Purpose for Presentation

#### California Penal Code 1203.016:

- ✓ Authorizes Sheriff, with Board of Supervisors approval, to offer home detention with electronic monitoring in lieu of custodial sentence
- ✓ Authority limited to sentenced individuals
- ✓ Program rules subject to annual review by Board of Supervisors

#### San Francisco Sheriff's Electronic Monitoring Program:

- ✓ Post-sentence participants as authorized by 1203.016 (currently no participants)
- ✓ Pre-sentence participants as ordered by the court (99+% of total participants)



## Increase in Electronic Monitoring

- FY2017-18:
  - ✓ First District Court of Appeal ruled in Re Humphrey that money bail violated due process and required courts to consider alternatives when setting release conditions
  - ✓ EM Participation as ordered by the courts has increased dramatically since this ruling

#### ✓ Decision Making Framework Recommendation:

- Green: OR No Active Supervision
- Yellow: OR Minimum Supervision
- Orange: Assertive Case Management (ACM)
- Red: Release Not Recommended (RNR)
- ✓ Public Safety Assessment provides information to the Court Advisory Only
- ✓ Court makes final determination



# Increase in High Need/Risk Participants on EM

- ✓ Increase in Pretrial caseload on ACM with court-ordered EM
  - November 2019: 58 percent
  - January 2022: 77 percent
- ✓ ACM supervision includes:
  - In-person check-in with Pretrial case manager
  - Support group sessions
  - Court date reminders
  - Custody needs assessment
- ✓ Increase in court-ordered EM with RNR advisory
  - 2018: 57 percent
  - 2021: 69 percent
- ✓ Increase in caseload with ACM/RNR indicative that those on EM are increasingly likely to have been assessed as high needs and/or high risk



## Initiatives for Program Success

- ✓ New Devices with longer battery life and shorter charge time
- √ 24/7 availability of staff and resources at 70 Oak Grove
- ✓ Sheriff working with Courts to provide EM history to allow for better decision-making regarding future EM assignment
- ✓ Sheriff collaborated with California Policy Lab for pre-trial EM program evaluation
