#### PROJECT SUMMARY

The Japantown Buchanan Mall is a publicly-owned walkway located at the geographic and cultural heart of the San Francisco Japantown, on Buchanan Street between Post and Sutter Streets. It is lined with shops which help to activate the space, with a paved cobblestone river connecting two fountain installations consisting of origami flower forms designed by renowned artist Ruth Asawa. The community perceives that Buchanan Mall is difficult to walk on, and that it could be further activated. To address these concerns, the San Francisco Planning Department and Department of Public Works will work with the community to improve Buchanan Mall. The project will focus on three main priorities:

- Enhance accessibility of the mall for seniors and people with disabilities and limited mobility
- Rehabilitate the Ruth Asawa fountains that are iconic to the mall
- Support the business community by embellishing the sense of cultural authenticity and enhancing the commercial edges of the mall

### Potential concepts and solutions include:

- Repaving the side walkways, planting more trees, landscaping with culturally relevant plants, and enhancing the existing historic public art (historic fountains, cobblestone river and Torii gate) with new, complementary public art
- Improve conditions for businesses to provide outdoor seating and displays along the storefronts, while maintaining an accessible path of travel
- Utilizing new energy- and water-efficient technologies to light the plaza and maintain the fountains

#### Improvements to Buchanan Mall could:

- Increase the attractiveness of the shopping district, thereby increasing business viability and helping keep Japantown the hub of the Japanese community in the region
- Help restaurants attract more customers with outdoor seating
- Create better public space, thereby increasing livability
- Draw more people to an area intended to reflect a modern version of the Japanese village aesthetic, thereby created a sense of Japan
- Improve the functionality of the fountain and street design
- Improve the neighborhood's landscaping, lighting, street furnishings, and wayfinding


