The purpose of National Human Immunodeficiency Virus Behavioral Surveillance (NHBS) in San Francisco is to conduct bio-behavioral surveillance activities among populations overburdened by Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). NHBS will estimate levels and monitor changes over time in HIV prevalence and related risk and preventive behaviors. The short-term aims are to collect and use data to measure prevention, testing, and treatment program reach; guide the development and strengthening of these efforts; evaluate prevention activities; and inform prevention policy. Long-term use of NHBS data will improve prevention, care, and treatment services to reduce the burden and incidence of HIV.
