

# VOLUNTARY REMEDIAL ACTION PROGRAM

### Voluntary Remedial Action Program (VRAP)

- <u>Goal</u>: To protect human health, clean-up environment, and return property back to productive use when a release of hazardous waste occurs, and remedial action is required within City and County of San Francisco.
- Initiated by responsible party requesting local agency to oversee cleanup.
- Allows a local health agency to enter into a written agreement with the responsible party to set up cleanup goals, supervise the remedial investigation and/or action, and issue a letter or other document that certifies that the cleanup goals have been met.
- State agencies notified and choose not to oversee the cleanup.







#### **VRAP** History

- VRAP authorized by HSC §101480- 101490 established in 1996 (Senate Bill 1248)
- Assembly Bill 304 (January 1, 2022)
  - Definition of "Local Officer" amended to "a county health officer, city health officer, or county director of environmental health who has been granted authority by the city's or county's governing body to enter into remedial action agreements and oversee remedial action at waste release sites."







#### Proposed Resolution

• Authorizes County Health Officer or the Health Officer's designee and the Department of Public Health's Director of Environmental Health Branch or the Director's designee to enter into a remedial investigation or remedial action, or both at a waste release site in accordance with California Health and Safety Code ("HSC") §§101480-101490.
