#### **Community Youth Center of San Francisco (CYC)**

• Mentorship and case management services for middle and high school youth

#### **Flyaway Productions**

Dance and activism program for teens

#### **Huckleberry Youth Programs**

• Case management for commercially sexually exploited girls and young women, and those at risk of exploitation, ages 10-24

#### Lavender Youth Recreation and Information Center (LYRIC)

• Leadership program for undocumented LGBTQQ and ally youth, ages 14-24

#### **Mission Neighborhood Centers**

 Gender-based violence awareness prevention and education program via 8-week girls' groups within SFUSD schools and community sites; case management for girls involved in the juvenile justice system

#### **Oasis for Girls**

• Life skills program serving girls aged 14-18

#### **Special Service for Groups**

• Gender-responsive services to young women involved and/or at-risk of involvement in the juvenile justice system

#### University of California, San Francisco

 Gender-responsive care for young women involved in the juvenile justice system

#### Young Women's Freedom Center

Resources and programming for young women who have been involved with the juvenile justice system and/or the underground street economy

# **Key Partnerships**

 San Francisco Unified School District Wellness Centers – DCYF funded Wellness Centers at 17 SFUSD High Schools in FY21-22. Wellness Centers provide a safe, confidential setting where experts in adolescent health help teens gain the skills they need to cope with complex issues and learn positive, lifelong habits.

 Expect Respect SF Collaborative – A City College of San Francisco (CCSF) program and a community collaborative of San Francisco gender-based violence prevention programs working to promote healthy and violence-free dating through youthcentered, culturally-sensitive education.

## Child Adolescent Support Advocacy Resource Center (CASARC)

- Serves children and adolescents (up to age 18) who have been sexually or physically abused or who have witnessed severe violence. Forensic medical and crisis management services are available 24 hours a day

### Seneca MRT

- Supports youth or caregiver/family members who need support in staying safe. MRT focuses on safety planning and de-escalating in challenging behavioral or mental health situations
