Ordinance amending the San Francisco Public Works Code by amending Sections 184.69, 184.70, and 184.72 to ban distribution of handbills on private premises unless the handbills are securely placed upon or attached to and do not damage the premises, specifying a minimum of 30-point font size for "No Handbills" signs, and replacing criminal penalties for unlawful distribution of handbills with administrative penalties, and making environmental findings.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. FINDINGS AND LEGISLATIVE INTENT.

On November 23, 2010 the Menu and Flyer Littering Task Force ("Task Force"), a task force created by the Department of Public Works, issued "Keep SF Clean", a report outlining its recommendations to reduce the litter generated through the distribution of handbills. The Task Force's report found that existing provisions of the Public Works Code related to handbill distribution do not address neighborhood concerns and are lacking in a number of areas, including:

- (1) Legally distributed flyers often end up in the street because they are not affixed to premises;
- (2) Property owners say the eight inch "No Handbills" sign required by the Code is too large and unattractive;

- (3) Current sanctions are criminal penalties, and because handbill litter is a low priority in the District Attorney's Office, the prospect of criminal prosecution has little to no deterrent effect on illegal handbill distribution; and
- (4) No City agency captures complaints and actions taken, or tracks any data needed for analysis concerning handbills.

The Task Force, which was comprised of representatives from community based organizations, the Golden Gate Restaurant Association, neighborhood organizations, the Small Business Commission, Department of Public Health, and Department of Public Works, recommended that the Public Works Code be amended to:

- (1) Require distributors to attach or secure handbills in a manner that prevents them from being blown away by the wind while also making sure the handbill allows doors or gates to properly close shut;
- (2) Modify the signage requirement by allowing varied signage sizes providing that at a minimum the words "No Handbills" is included in at least a 30 point font; and
  - (3) Replace criminal penalties with administrative penalties.

Therefore, it is the intent of the Board to amend the Public Works Code to incorporate the recommendations of the Task Force in order to address neighborhood and Department of Public Works concerns related to handbill distribution.

Section 2. The San Francisco Public Works Code is hereby amended by amending Sections 184.69, 1184.70, and 184.72, to read as follows:

#### SEC. 184.69. DEFINITIONS.

For the purposes of this Article:

(a) "Adhesive" means any glue, sticky tape, or similar substance that harms any structure, including any building, or that leaves behind any residue after being removed.

- (a) (b) "Board" means the Board of Supervisors of the City.
- (b) (c) "City" means the City and County of San Francisco.
- (e) (d) "Department" means the Department of Public Works of the City.
- (d) (e) "Director" means the Director of the Department of Public Works of the City. Director shall mean and include an officer or employee of the City designated to act on the Director's behalf.
- (e) (f) "Handbill" means any handbill, dodger, circular, booklet, card, pamphlet, sheet or any other kind of printed matter or literature which is distributed to or upon any premises in the City. Handbill shall not include a <u>Newspaper or a</u> Sign, as that term is defined and regulated by Sections 184.56 to 186.68, inclusive, of this Code.
- ## (g) "Newspaper" means a publication that (1) is printed, published, and circulated at regular intervals, including, but not limited to, daily, weekly, bi-weekly, and monthly circulation, (2) contains at least 3 separate sheets of paper, and (3) has printed matter on at least one side of the paper.
- (g) (h) "Person" means any individual person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, organization, society, group or legal entity of any kind.
- (i) "Secured" means attached or placed in a manner that does not prevent a door or gate from properly closing, latching, or locking, and ensures that the wind cannot blow away the attached object.

### SEC. 184.70. DISTRIBUTION OF HANDBILLS ON PRIVATE PREMISES.

(a) Findings. The Board hereby finds and declares that the City has a compelling need to prohibit the distribution of Handbills on private premises where the occupant has expressed his or her unwillingness to receive such Handbills. Prohibiting distributions of Handbills in defiance of an occupant's expressed desire not to receive them strikes an

appropriate accommodation between the rights of distributors to solicit willing listeners with the rights of occupants to object to receive the material.

This Ordinance is also aimed at decreasing the adverse effects <u>on the community</u> of the distribution of unsolicited <u>Hand-bills</u> <u>Handbills</u> on private premises. The prohibition against delivering Handbills contrary to the expressed desire of the occupant and the requirement that Handbills be <u>secured folded or otherwise attached</u> to the outside of a premises will decrease the amount of litter <u>that</u> Handbills <u>create</u>.

- (b) Prohibition When "No Handbills" Sign Posted. It shall be unlawful for any person to distribute, cause to be distributed, or suffer, allow or permit the distribution of any Handbill to or upon any private premises in the City by placing or causing any such Handbill to be deposited or placed in or upon any porch, yard, steps, hallway, or mailbox located on, or used in connection with such premises when such premises has posted thereon in a conspicuous place, a notice or notices of at least eight square inches in area bearing, including at a minimum the words "No Handbills," or the like, unless such Person has received the written permission of the occupant of such premises authorizing the Person so to distribute. Each letter of the words "No Handbills" shall be in at least 30 point font size. The occupant may include additional words and/or icons to the notice or notices.
- (c) Distributed Matter To Be *Folded Secured*. It shall be unlawful for any Person to distribute, cause to be distributed, or suffer, allow or permit the distribution of any Handbill to or upon any private premises in the City by placing or causing any such Handbill to be deposited or placed in or upon any porch, yard, steps, *handrail*, hallway, or mailbox located on, or used in connection with such premises unless the *person has secured it. It shall be unlawful to use any adhesive in the distribution of handbills. same is folded or otherwise so prepared that it will not be blown therefrom by the winds.*

# SEC. 184.72. CRIMINAL ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES.

Any Person who violates any provision of this Article shall be guilty of an infraction and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250.

The Director may issue administrative citations for the violation of Section 184.70. San

Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 100, "Procedures Governing the Imposition of Administrative

Fines," is hereby incorporated in its entirety and shall govern the amount of fees and the procedure for imposition, enforcement, collection, and administrative review of administrative citations issued under this Section.

# Section 3. Environmental Findings.

The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 101522 and is incorporated herein by reference.

#### **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Public Works Code - Handbill Distribution Ordinance]

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Public Works Code by amending Sections 184.69, 184.70, and 184.72 to ban distribution of handbills on private premises unless they are securely placed upon or attached to and do not damage the premises, specifying a minimum of 30 point font size for "No Handbills" signs, and replacing criminal penalties for unlawful distribution of handbills with administrative penalties.

#### Existing Law

- (1) bans distributions of handbills unless they are folded otherwise prepared or placed so that they cannot be blown away by the wind.
- (2) bans distribution of handbills to premises that display a "No Handbills" sign "at least eight inches square in area."
- (3) makes violations of these bans infractions.

#### Amendments to Current Law

- 1) requires that handbills be attached or placed in a manner that does not prevent a door or gate from properly closing, latching, or locking, does not leave and, does not damage the structure or leave a residue and ensures that the wind cannot blow away the attached object. (2) specifies a minimum 30 point font size for the "No Handbills" notice.
- (3) eliminates the infraction penalty and instead prescribes administrative penalties for violations.

#### **Background Information**

Current law does not adequately address the distribution of handbills.
