Provide information on contingency management programming:

- Contingency management for stimulant use disorder has been provided for years through OBIC (formerly known as the Office-Based Buprenorphine Induction Clinic), the Stimulant Treatment Outpatient Program (STOP) at Citywide Clinic, and at the San Francisco AIDS Foundation since 2019 (via the PROP program for men who have sex with men, now expanded to PROP for all).
- Our overdose response is funding programmatic growth in contingency management for stimulant use disorder: beginning in August 2022, the San Francisco AIDS Foundation expanded its contingency management sites, and we added this service to the Bayview Navigation Center.
- BHS also offers contingency management for opioid use disorder through several programs (Bridge, HOUDINI, JUNO).

Provide additional information on the three providers who will participate in the Drug Medi-Cal Contingency Management pilot program.

California DHCS will launch a Drug Medi-Cal Contingency Management pilot program for stimulant use disorder in early 2023. Three local programs have signed up to be a part of the pilot:

- Citiwide STOP
 - Budget estimate: \$241,386
 - Client estimate: 20
- Opiate Treatment Outpatient Program (OTOP)
 - Budget estimate: \$466,524
 - Client estimate: 200
- HealthRIGHT 360
 - Budget estimate: \$495,215
 - Client estimate: 60

The pilot does not provide direct funding but will reimburse start-up costs and contingency management coordinator visits. Data gathered from the pilot will help determine what longer-term costs and demand for services would be.

Abstinence treatment programs

We aim to provide our treatment programs in alcohol and drug-free environments to support the recovery of everyone. All SFDPH treatment programs funded through the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Waiver support reducing and stopping harmful drug use and support people who relapse by offering more treatment. One of our outcome measures is reduction or elimination of drug or alcohol use. In FY 21-22, 69.2% of clients achieved this measure.
