

1	[Commending Congresswoman Jackie Speier]
2	
3	Resolution commending Congresswoman Jackie Speier on the occasion of her
4	retirement from the United States Congress after 14 years as a Member of the United
5	States House of Representatives, and nearly 40 years as an elected leader for the San
6	Francisco Bay Area.
7	
8	WHEREAS, Congresswoman Speier began her career in public service as an aide to
9	California Representative Leo Ryan; and
10	WHEREAS, In 1978, Congresswoman Speier accompanied Congressman Ryan on a
11	trip to Jonestown in Guyana to rescue San Francisco and other Bay Area residents from cult
12	leader Jim Jones, after receiving reports of abuse and hostage taking by Jim Jones and
13	member of his Cult, the People's Temple Cult; and
14	WHEREAS, Congressman Ryan and several others in the official delegation were
15	killed, over 900 members of the People's Temple Cult also died, and Congresswoman Speier
16	was shot five times; and
17	WHEREAS, This tragedy led Congresswoman Speier to choose to be a survivor and
18	led to her first attempt at public office, running in the special election for Congressman Ryan's
19	seat after his death; and
20	WHEREAS, While Congresswoman Speier ultimately lost that election, it inspired her
21	to run for local office; and
22	WHEREAS, Congresswoman Speier was first elected to the San Mateo County Board
23	of Supervisors in 1980, defeating a 20-year incumbent; and
24	WHEREAS, Congresswoman Speier was the youngest person elected to the San
25	Mateo County Board of Supervisors at the time; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Speier was elected to the California State Assembly in
 1986, representing northern San Mateo County, where she served five terms; and
 WHEREAS, In 1998, Congresswoman Speier was elected to the California State
 Senate where she served two terms; and

5 WHEREAS, During her time in the California State Legislature, Congresswoman 6 Speier had over 300 bills signed into law by both Democratic and Republican Governors; and 7 WHEREAS, As a member of the California State Legislature, Congresswoman Speier 8 was a champion for women and children, she authored laws that created the modern 9 California Child Care licensing system, created the first regulations for car seats and life preservers for children, created the fund to prevent childhood injury, passed the law requiring 10 11 that physicians be mandatory reporters for suspected domestic violence, authored the statute 12 to require women's contraception be covered by insurance policies; and reformed the Child 13 Support regulations, increasing child support payments by \$800 million over three years, and 14 floor-jockeyed the California Assault Rifle Ban through the California Senate floor; and 15 WHEREAS, As a California State Legislator, Congresswoman Speier also fought for

16 consumer protections, passing the strongest law to prevent the sale of personal financial
17 information, and prevented price discrimination in services for women; and

18 WHEREAS, In 2008, Congresswoman Speier was elected to Congress; and 19 WHEREAS, During her tenure in Congress, Congresswoman Speier has been a 20 champion for her district, she has fought for consumer rights, voted against big banks and 21 ended their taxpayer bailouts; eliminated wasteful and fraudulent spending from the federal 22 government, particularly the Department of Defense; fought for justice for service members 23 who are survivors of sexual assault and transgender service members experiencing discrimination; fought relentlessly for the LGBTQ+ community, appeared at San Francisco 24 25 City Hall in 2008 to marry couples and returned in 2015, after the Supreme Court overturned Prop 8 to officiate more ceremonies; fought for women's rights, brought the Me Too
reckoning to Congress, championed the Equal Rights Amendment, fought for abortion rights,
was the first member to talk about her own abortion on the House floor, and fought for
investments in childcare and paid leave; fought against the gun lobby, serving as Co-Chair of
the Gunviolence Prevention Taskforce and co-sponsored multiple gun buybacks; and
protected privacy rights for victims of cyber-attacks and revenge porn; and

WHEREAS, In direct service of San Francisco, Congresswoman Speier championed
the safety of all residents by taking on Pacific Gas & Electric after the 2010 San Bruno
explosion, resulting in many miles of failing PG&E lines being replaced in San Francisco;
succeeded in increasing federal funding for the San Francisco Bay Restoration program;
supported public transportation, securing tens of millions of dollars for SF Muni and Caltrain;
and sought review by the General Accountability Office of a Trump-era decision to fine San
Francisco for alleged water quality violations; and

14 WHEREAS, Congresswoman Jackie Speier has dedicated her life to public service;15 and

16 RESOLVED, That Congresswoman Speier is retiring from the United States Congress 17 after 14 years as a Member of the United States House of Representatives, and nearly forty 18 years as an elected leader in the San Francisco Bay Area; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
 Francisco extends its deepest appreciation and commends Congresswoman Jackie Speier for
 her nearly 40 years of distinguished and dedicated service as a representative for San
