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3	Resolution of intent to waive the Major Encroachment Permit Fee and the Street
4	Improvement Fees for the Detroit Street Stairs project.
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6	WHEREAS, The Detroit Steps Project (DSP) was launched at the Sunnyside
7	Neighborhood Association Quarterly Meeting on November 5, 2018; and
8	WHEREAS, The Detroit Steps are a two-block public stairway in the Sunnyside
9	neighborhood in District 7 of San Francisco, comprising 185 steps that run from Detroit and
10	Hearst to Detroit and Joost, bisected by Monterey Boulevard; and
11	WHEREAS, The Detroit Street Steps Project is a multi-phase community-led project
12	that aims at improving with lighting, and beautifying with landscaping and tiling a 185-step
13	stairway spanning two sections: the Lower Steps (from Hearst to Monterey) and the Upper
14	Steps (from Monterey to Joost; and
15	WHEREAS, This beautification project is transforming a neglected neighborhood site
16	into a safe pedestrian walkway; and
17	WHEREAS, The Detroit Street Steps project is also turning the steps into an inspiring
18	local destination promoting health and well being to residents and visitors; and
19	WHEREAS, In 2019 the beautification began with the replacement of the lower steps
20	fence replacement and a water meter and backflow device installation; and
21	WHEREAS, In 2020 The San Francisco Parks Alliance became the Detroit Street
22	Steps fiscal sponsor; and
23	WHEREAS. In 2021, the Upper Steps Fence was replaced with funds from the District
24	7 Community Grant Initiative, and

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1	WHEREAS, The Detroit Street Steps in 2021 became one of twenty-eight recipients of
2	a grant from the Neighborhood Beautification Grant Fund; and
3	WHEREAS, A Request for Proposals went out to local artists and Brad Kessler
4	Welding was selected and signed on by the San Francisco Parks Alliance as a contractor for
5	the Detroit Steps Archway in July, 2022; and
6	WHEREAS, The proposed Archway is an integral part of the multi-year and multiphase
7	community lead project to beautify the Detroit Street Steps; and
8	WHEREAS; The Civic Design Review Committee of the San Francisco Art
9	Commission approved the design of the archway on August 15, 2022; and
10	WHEREAS, Pursuant to Public Works Code, Section 786, the proposed Major
11	Encroachment Permit must be approved by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors states its intention to waive the Major
13	Encroachment Permit Fees and Street Improvement Fees associated with the Detroit Street
14	Steps Project; and, be it
15	FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors urges Public Works to review the
16	Detroit Street Steps Archway project.
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
