1 [Emergency Contract - Retroactive - Health Management Associates, Inc. - Specialized Consulting Services - Not to Exceed \$5,863,302]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to enter into an 3 emergency contract with Health Management Associates, Inc., in compliance with 4 Section 21.15 of the Administrative Code requiring approval by the Board of 5 Supervisors for any emergency contract in excess of \$100,000 for the purpose of 6 providing specialized consulting services, in an amount not to exceed \$3,782,365 for a 7 term of thirteen and one-half months, from May 9, 2022, through June 30, 2023; and 8 approving Amendment 1 to the agreement for providing specialized consulting 9 services to increase the agreement by \$2,080,937 for an amount not to exceed 10 \$5,863,302 with no change to the contract term from May 9, 2022, through June 30, 11 2023; and to authorize the Department of Public Health to enter into any amendments 12 or modifications to the contract that do not otherwise materially increase the 13 obligations or liabilities to the City and are necessary or advisable to effectuate the 14 purposes of the contract or this Resolution. 15

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WHEREAS, On October 14, 2021, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) 17 completed an extended survey at Laguna Honda Hospital (LHH) of two incidents of non-fatal 18 drug overdoses; in February 2022, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) 19 issued LHH \$243,045 in civil monetary penalties based on those deficiencies; between 20 January 21, 2022, and April 13, 2022, CDPH conducted three revisits, where it found 21 additional deficiencies that showed that LHH was out of compliance with all applicable 22 Medicare Conditions of Participation; on April 13, 2022, CDPH and CMS informed LHH that 23 since it was still out of compliance with the applicable Medicare Conditions of Participation, 24

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1 termination of the CMS Provider Agreement and certification in the Medicare/Medicaid 2 program would become effective at 12:01 a.m. on April 14, 2022; and 3 WHEREAS, LHH intends to seek reinstatement of its Medicare/Medicaid program certification and execute a new CMS Provider Agreement; to obtain reinstatement and a new 4 5 Provider Agreement, the Department of Public Health (DPH) must demonstrate that LHH 6 substantially complies with all applicable Medicare Conditions of Participation; the 7 reapplication process will include an application, an initial survey, a 3-4-month reasonable 8 assurance period, and a second survey to ensure that LHH remains in substantial 9 compliance; and WHEREAS, Should DPH's reinstatement efforts fail, DPH would begin to lose up to 10 \$17 million monthly in Medicare and Medicaid funding; further, without this funding, DPH 11 12 could be forced to close LHH, which would require transfer and relocation of all LHH patients; 13 and 14 WHEREAS, There is a need to enter into contracts with qualified providers for specialized services in support of LHH recertification efforts; and 15 WHEREAS, The initial consultation has identified additional areas to support LHH 16 recertification efforts; now, therefore, be it 17 18 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby retroactively authorizes the Director of Public Health and the Director of the Office of Contract Administration/Purchaser, on behalf 19 20 of the City and County of San Francisco, to enter into an emergency contract for providing specialized consulting services in support of LHH recertification efforts, in the amount of 21 \$3,782,365 for the term of thirteen and one-half months, from May 9, 2022, through June 30, 22 23 2023; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director 24 of Public Health and the Director of the Office of Contract Administration/Purchaser, on behalf 25

of the City and County of San Francisco, to enter into an Amendment 1 to the agreement for
providing specialized consulting services in support of LHH recertification efforts, to increase
the original agreement of \$3,782,365 by \$2,080,937 for an amount not to exceed \$5,863,302
for a total agreement term of thirteen and one-half months, from May 9, 2022, through June
30, 2023; and, be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of 7 Public Health to enter into any amendments or modifications to the contract, prior to its final 8 execution by all parties, that the Department determines, in consultation with the City 9 Attorney, are in the best interests of the City, do not otherwise materially increase the 10 obligations or liabilities of the City, are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of 11 the contract, and are in compliance with all applicable laws; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of Amendment 1 being fully
executed by all parties, the Director of Health and/or the Director of the Office of Contract
Administration/Purchaser shall provide the final contacts to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion
into the official File No. 220920.
