[Updated Annual Fundraising Drive - 2022]

Resolution updating the proposed designation of agencies qualified to participate in the 2022 Annual Joint Fundraising Drive for officers and employees of the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, City and County of San Francisco Administrative Code, Section 16.93-4 requires that by May 1st of each year, the Board of Supervisors, by Resolution, shall designate agencies that qualify to participate in the City's Annual Fundraising Drive for that year; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 16.93-2, participation in the Annual Fundraising Drive is limited to any Mayor's fund which is created to further social causes, those funds being the Mayor's Youth Fund, the Mayor's Homeless Fund, and the Mayor's Youth Employment Summer Program, and to all federated agencies that meet the following criteria, as determined by the Board of Supervisors:

- Represents ten or more charitable organizations, of which at least 50
 percent represent organizations located in the counties of San Francisco,
 San Mateo, Santa Clara, Alameda, Contra Costa, and Marin;
- 2. Certifies to the Board that the Internal Revenue Service has determined that contributions to the represented charitable organizations are tax deductible;
- 3. Has been in existence with ten or more qualified charities for at least one year prior to the date of application and provide satisfactory evidence to that effect at the time of filing an application with the Board;
- Submits its most recent certified audit at the time of filing an application with the Board;

5. Submits an application to the Board that includes all information that may be relevant to the criteria listed above; and,

WHEREAS, The following federated agencies each submitted an application for participation in the 2022 Annual Fundraising Drive: America's Best Local Charities; EarthShare; Global Impact; and CHC: Creating Healthier Communities (formerly Community Health Charities California); and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 16.93-3, the City Administrator's Office reviewed all applications and recommended to the Board of Supervisors that all the above federated agencies met the criteria set out in Section 16.93-2; and

WHEREAS, On April 19, 2022, the Board approved a Resolution in Board File No. 220251 designating all the federated agencies as qualified to participate in the Annual Fundraising Drive because they met the requirements contained in the Administrative Code, Section 16.93-2; and

WHEREAS, The City Administrator's Office wishes to clarify its interpretation of the criteria in Administrative Code, Section 16.93-2(a), as follows:

An applicant must be a federated agency representing 10 or more charitable organizations that meets one of the following criteria:

- a. Has an office located in the Bay Area (defined as Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma counties, as well as the PUC jurisdictions of Stanislaus County, Calaveras County, and Tuolumne County); or,
- b. Provides services in the Bay Area, defined as Alameda, Contra
 Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano,

and Sonoma counties, as well as the PUC jurisdictions of Stanislaus

County, Calaveras County, and Tuolumne County);

In addition, each federated agency must commit to directing donations received

In addition, each federated agency must commit to directing donations received through the 2022 Joint Fundraising Drive to support those Bay Area offices and/or services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby finds and determines that the requirements of Administrative Code, Section 16.93-2, have been met by the following applicants:

America's Best Local Charities; EarthShare; and CHC: Creating Healthier Communities (formerly Community Health Charities California); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this updated list of designated agencies supersedes the list approved in Board File No. 220251; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the designated federated agencies shall fulfill all obligations and responsibilities required of participants in the City's 2022 Annual Fundraising Drive.
