FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer is authorized to execute on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco the necessary grant agreement with CSA, including any amendments thereto; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That federal grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by the Board of Supervisors; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco agrees to abide by the statutes and regulations governing the federal Formula Grants Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the CSA.
