13	WHEREAS, San Francisco prioritizes contracting opportunities for Local Business
14	Enterprises (LBEs) to ensure that local small businesses are able to bid for and be awarded
15	contracting bids; and
16	WHEREAS, In addition to prioritizing LBEs in City and County contracts, it is crucial to
17	collect and analyze data on which LBEs are being awarded bids and which are not in order to
18	identify disparities between groups that have been historically disadvantaged; and
19	WHEREAS, The City and County must utilize an evidence-based approach to righting
20	past wrongs and securing economic justice for minority-owned, women-owned, and disabled
21	Veteran-owned businesses, their employees, and their families; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the City Administrator's Office to
23	conduct a disparity study to analyze disparities in the City and County of San Francisco's
