16	Section 1. Background.	
17	(a) On July 26, 2022, the Board of Supervisors adopted the Annual Budget and	
18	Appropriation Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. (Ord. No. 161-22.) The ordinance	
19	appropriated approximately \$23 million to the Department of Elections for a variety of uses.	
20	The ordinance appropriated approximately \$70,000 to the Elections Commission to fund the	
21	salary and benefits of the Elections Commission Secretary. The ordinance did not specifically	
22	appropriate funds to finance a search to fill the five-year term for the Director of Elections	
23	position that is scheduled to commence on May 21, 2023.	
24	(b) Under Charter Section 13.104, the Elections Commission appoints the Director of	
25	Elections to a five-year term. The current term will end on May 20, 2023. Under Civil Service	

Rule 114.34, a competitive search process is not required if the Elections Commission
 decides to renew the term of an incumbent Director without engaging in a competitive search.

(c) At its November 16, 2022 meeting, the Elections Commission voted to engage in a

term, and invited the incumbent Director of Elections to apply.

9 The Department of Elections and Elections Commission may not expend any funds 10 appropriated for the Department or Commission in the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Annual Budget 11 and Appropriation Ordinance (Ord. No. 161-22) for the purpose of contracting with a vendor to 12 provide services in a search to fill the position of Director of Elections for the upcoming five-13 year term. The Controller is hereby prohibited from any transfer of budgeted appropriations 14 for this purpose.

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Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
