13	Section 1. Article IV-A of Chapter 16 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
14	revising the title of Article IV-A, and Sections 16.89-15 and 16.89-16, to read as follows:
15	ARTICLE IV-A
16	RESIGNATIONS OF CITY OFFICERS <u>AND OTHER APPOINTEES</u>
17	
18	SEC. 16.89-15. METHOD OF RESIGNATION.
19	(a) For purposes of this Article IV-A, the term "officer" shall mean any member of a board
20	or commission or any department head listed in Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code Sections
21	$\underline{3.1-103(a)(1)\ or\ (b)(1)}$. The term "other appointed member" shall mean any other person appointed to
22	serve on a City body (such as an advisory body) established in the Charter or by ordinance.
23	(b) An officer or other appointed member may resign by submitting a written resignation,
24	Resignations shall be in writing, and made as follows:
25	$\frac{(a)}{(1)}$ By elected officers, to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; and

1	(b) (2) By appointed officers and other appointed members, to the body or officer that
2	appointed them.
3	(c) This Article IV-A does not in any way limit or modify those circumstances in which a
4	resignation occurs by operation of law.
5	(d) It shall be against City policy for an appointing authority to ask or require a person
6	seeking or being considered for appointment to a City office, or to any other City body (such as an
7	advisory body) established in the Charter or by ordinance, to prepare, submit, or sign a letter of
8	resignation before the appointment takes effect or as a condition of their reappointment. Once the
9	appointment takes effect, the decision whether to resign shall rest with the appointee in their sole
10	discretion, and the ability to resign under this Article IV-A may not be delegated or otherwise
11	reassigned back to the appointing authority. The foregoing sentence does not prohibit an appointing
12	authority from asking an appointee to resign at any point during the appointee's tenure, or from
13	removing or seeking to remove an appointee under the removal procedures set forth in the Charter.
14	
15	SEC. 16.89-16. EFFECTIVE DATE.
16	Such resignation shall become effective, $\underline{u}\underline{U}$ nless otherwise stated in the written
17	resignation, $\underline{a\ resignation\ shall\ take\ effect\ immediately}}$ at the time $\underline{it\ is\ at\ which\ they\ are}$ -received:
18	(a) By the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, when submitted by an
19	elected officer; or
20	(b) By the office of the appointing authority, when submitted by an appointed officer
21	or other appointed member.
22	
23	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
24	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board		
2	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

4	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors		
5	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,		
6	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal		
7	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment		
8	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under		
9	the official title of the ordinance.

[Administrative Code - Resignations from City Boards and Commissions]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish a City policy against seeking preemptive resignation letters from persons seeking or being considered for appointment or reappointment to City boards and commissions and other City bodies

Existing Law

Article IV-A of Chapter 16 of the Administrative Code describes the process for City officers to resign from their positions. An appointed City officer – in other words, a department head or a member of a board or commission – may resign by submitting a resignation letter to the body or officer who appointed them (their "appointing authority").

Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance establishes a City policy that an appointing authority may not ask or require a person seeking or being considered for appointment to a City office to prepare or submit a letter of resignation before their appointment has taken effect or as a condition of their reappointment. The ordinance also provides that the resignation procedures for appointed City officers apply to members of advisory bodies established in the Charter or by ordinance.

Background Information

The ordinance is not intended to prohibit an appointing authority from asking an appointee to resign at any point during the appointee's tenure, or from removing or seeking to remove an appointee under the removal procedures set forth in the Charter.
