- To hire Department of Public Health information technology staff to support the approvals process, technical build, and implementation of CareLink and increase the number of organizations and individuals who are able to use CareLink.
- To onboard and train staff and optimize use and understanding of these CareLink functionalities.
- We will track numbers of new CareLink accounts and numbers of new staff onboarded and trained in Carelink.

Project \#1: San Francisco Department of Health (SFDPH) Information Technology (IT) Staff to
Support Approvals Process, Technical Infrastructure Build, and Implementation of CareLink:

- This funding will support the hiring of a SFDPH IT staff member to support the approvals process, technical build, and implementation of CareLink and increase the number of organizations and individuals who are able to use CareLink.
- Health plans and community-based organization (CBO) partners, including San Francisco Health Plan lead entities and Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH), will have access to SFDPH CareLink, but will have a wide range of support needs for implementation.
