1	[Park Branch Library Reopening]

3	Resolution recognizing the grand reopening of the Park Branch Library and
4	commending the San Francisco Public Library, and its team, for their hard work and
5	commitment to San Francisco and its residents.
6	
7	WHEREAS, The Branch Library Improvement Program (BLIP), funded by the bond
8	measure passed in November 2000 by the voters of San Francisco, calls for sixteen branches
9	to be renovated, four leased facilities to be replaced with City-owned buildings, three
10	branches to be replaced with new buildings, and one brand-new branch to be constructed in
11	Mission Bay; and
12	WHEREAS, The Park Branch Library has been fully remodeled and will celebrate its
13	grand reopening on Saturday, February 26, 2011, at 1:00 pm; and
14	WHEREAS, Originally built in 1909 and designed by the McDougall Brothers, the Park
15	Branch is the oldest library in San Francisco and is now fully accessible, technologically
16	updated and has been transformed into a state of the art library designed to serve the
17	neighborhood for many more decades to come; and
18	WHEREAS, The architecture team of Field Paoli and Joseph Chow & Associates, Inc.,
19	with historic consultation from Page & Turnbull, Inc., took great care to preserve the two-story
20	neoclassical brick and terracotta library building while bringing the facility into the 21st century
21	in terms of energy conservation, accessibility to all users, and changes in library service; and
22	WHEREAS, The sensitive restoration included new pendant ceiling light fixtures,
23	refinished historic tables and chairs, refurbished windows, refinished wood perimeter
24	shelving, and a newly painted ceiling in the Main Reading Room; and

WHEREAS, Additional highlights include new accessible restrooms, system upgrades,
 new furnishings, more computers, new teen area, revamped program area, updated
 children's section, a refreshed books and materials collection, and ergonomically designed
 staff work areas; and

WHEREAS, The Park Branch renovation is designed and built to silver certification
standards or greater under the U.S. Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and
Environmental Design (LEED) rating system and include green features such as a new
energy efficient heating system, efficient low-flow water faucets, a dedicated collection area
for recycling and compostable materials, and refinished furniture; and

10 WHEREAS, The library continued to serve the community during the branch 11 renovation by providing Bookmobile service on Stanyan Street and continuing story times at 12 the Park Police Station and the Ernest Ingold Clubhouse of the Boys & Girls Club; and 13 WHEREAS, The renovation has been a team effort between the San Francisco Public 14 Library staff and administrators, Department of Public Works' Project Management Bureau 15 and Bureau of Construction Management, Roebuck Construction, Library Commissioners, 16 Friends of the San Francisco Public Library, and members of the community who raised 17 funds and helped design the branch to suit their neighborhood's needs; now, therefore, be it 18 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors invites the public to join the celebration of 19 the rededication of the Park Branch Library on Saturday, February 26, 2011, at 1:00 pm at 20 the branch, 1833 Page Street (at Cole Street); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors commends the San Francisco Public Library, the Friends of the San Francisco Public Library, the Department of Public Works, members of the Haight-Ashbury neighborhood, and the entire team that made this project so successful for their dedication and hard work.
