10	companies in the Embarcadero Center; and
11	WHEREAS, The FruitGuys' model has helped inspire a global wellness industry that
12	now spans North and South America, Europe, Africa, and Oceania; and
13	WHEREAS, The FruitGuys donates all its excess weekly produce to local hunger relief
14	partners, notably St. Anthony's Foundation, which has been receiving donations since 1998,
15	and over the years has provided a total of more than four million servings to San Francisco
16	charities including Project Open Hand, Larkin Street Youth Services, and Hunters Point
17	Family, and more than 18 million total servings to charities nationwide; and
18	WHEREAS, The FruitGuys has encouraged its San Francisco clients to forward their

6	small grants with big impacts and has awarded grants to 105 farms in more than 32 states,
7	86% of which went to women and/or BIPOC-led farms, totaling more than \$412,000; and
8	WHEREAS, The FruitGuys is still family-owned and operated, celebrating its 25th year
9	of business led by the Mittelstaedt, Hinckle, and Muller families, employs 72 people, and
10	purchases from regional farms and local vendors near 11 hubs across the United States; now
