Modification Request

San Francisco-Marín Food Bank's Pop-Up Pantries

- Modification will allow program to continue till June 30th,2023
- Current Term: **July 1, 2022 – January 31, 2023**
- Extension: **February 1, 2023 – June 30, 2023**
- Current total not to exceed: **\$6,297,500**
- Proposed additional amount: **\$4,930,828**
- New total not to exceed: **\$11,228,328**



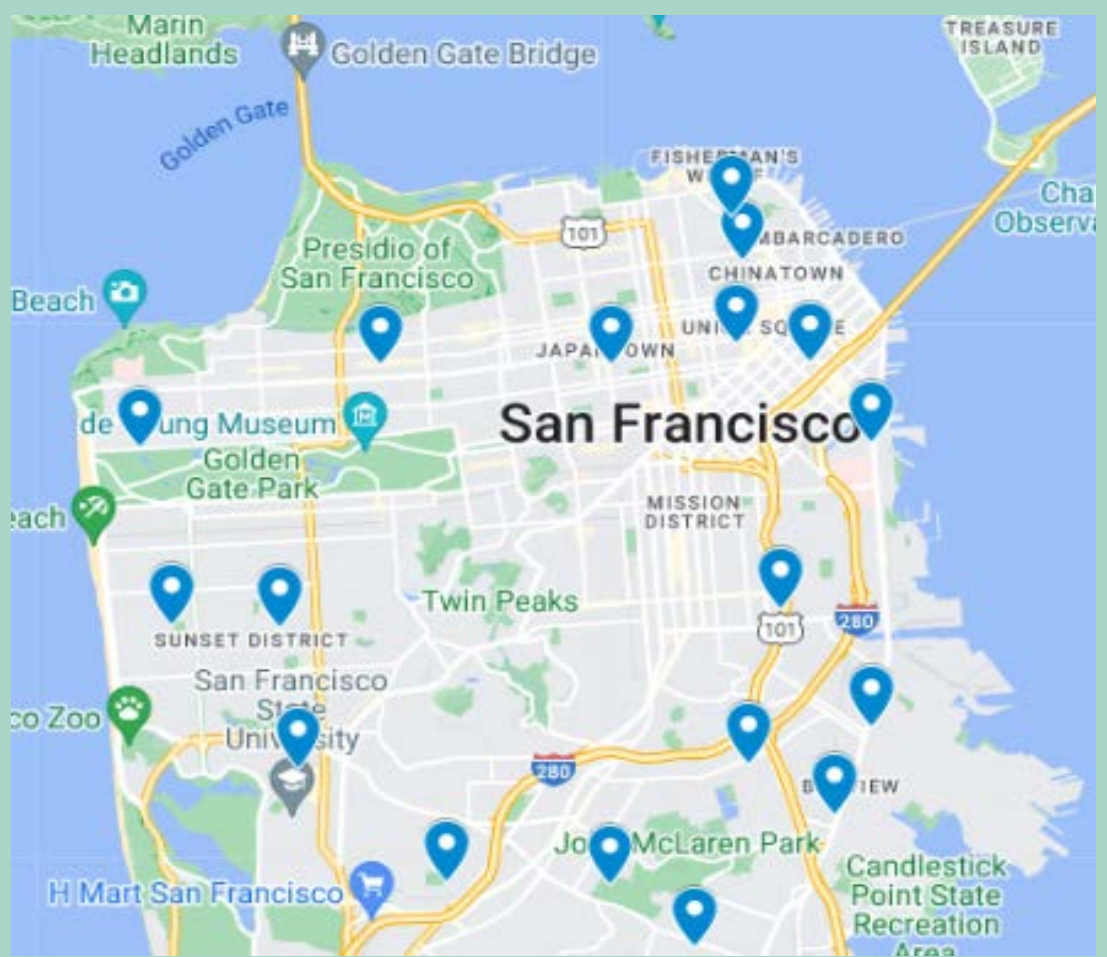
Pop-Up Pantries

- Large, outdoor grocery access points
- 20 sites
- July 2022 – December 2022
 - 435,000+ bags distributed
 - Average 72,000+ bags/month
 - Over 69,000 individuals served
- 21% increase in food support distributed between last FY and this FY (to date)
- 51 SF residents directly work on PUPs



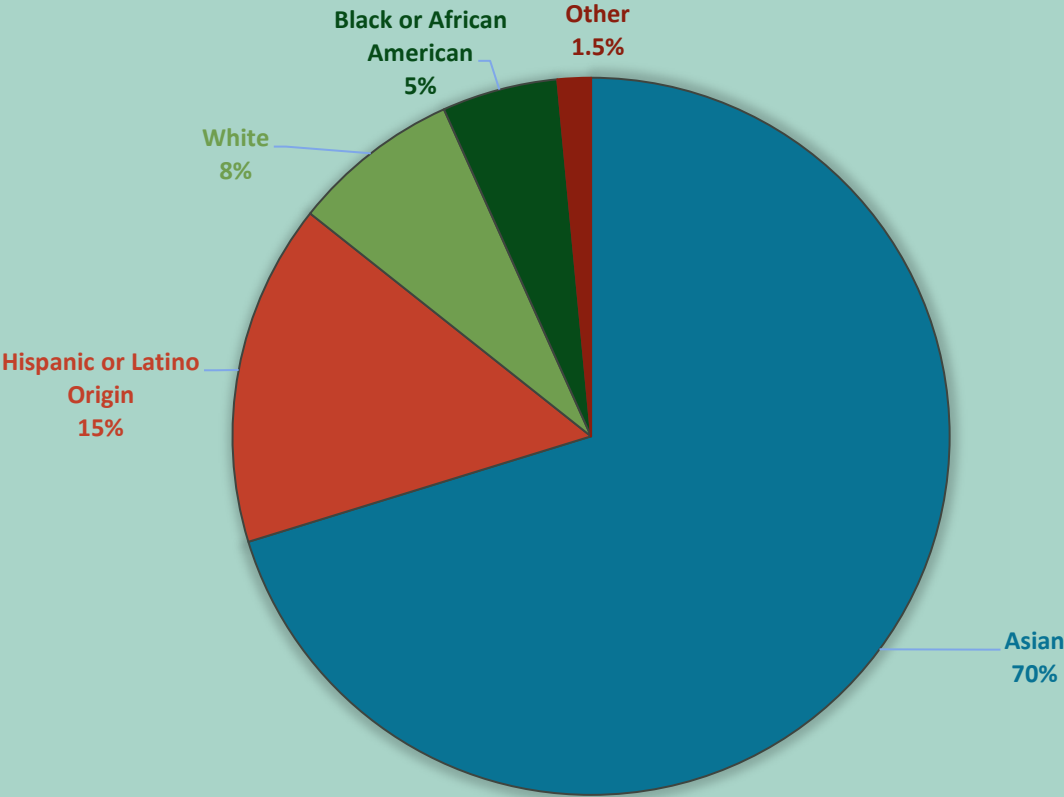

FY 21-22 Survey Results

- 'I like the food I get from the program' - 97% of respondents agreed
- 98% of respondents agreed that volunteers/staff provide good service
- 'In my culture, we eat the food that is offered in the program' - 90% agreed
- 71% of respondents said that their household had experienced a financial loss due to the pandemic
 - Out of which 71% indicated that they had yet to recover.
