SUBJECT: LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

The Board of Supervisors' Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee has received the following proposed legislation, introduced by Supervisor Mandelman on February 14, 2023:

## File No. 230162

Ordinance amending the Police Code to allow holders of temporary cannabis business permits to transfer an aggregate ownership interest of 50% or more in the business to persons that were not owners at the time the temporary permit was issued so long as five years or more have passed since the Office of Cannabis Director first acknowledged receipt of the business's application for a temporary cannabis business permit, regardless of whether the business has received a permanent cannabis business permit.

15	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

17	Section 1. Article 16 of the Police Code is hereby amended by revising Section 1608,		
18	to read as follows:		
19	SEC. 1608. TRANSFER OF PERMIT; PORTABILITY OF PERMIT; SALE OF CANNABIS		
20	BUSINESS; CHANGE IN OWNERSHIP; INTERIM CANNABIS BUSINESS PERMITS.

22	(c) Ownership; Changes in Ownership; Changes in Form or Structure.

24	(5) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection (c), prior to the award of $a$		
25	<i>permanentany</i> Cannabis Business Permit, <i>permanent or temporary</i> , and for five years following		

1 the date on which the Director has acknowledged acknowledges receipt of an application for a 2 Cannabis Business Permit from a particular Applicant or Permittee, an aggregate ownership 3 interest of 50% or more in *a that Applicant or* Permittee may not be transferred to any Person 4 or combination of Persons who were not Owners of the Permittee at the time that a Cannabis 5 Business Permit was *first* awarded to that Applicant or Permittee under this Article 16. This 6 restriction shall be cumulative, as to each Permittee, across any permits (whether temporary or 7 *permanent) issued under this Article 16.* Nothing in this subsection (c)(5) shall prohibit a holder of a 8 Temporary Cannabis Business Permit from transferring an aggregate ownership interest of 50% or 9 more in the Permittee prior to the award of a permanent Cannabis Business Permit to that Permittee 10 after five years have passed from the earliest date on which the Director acknowledged receipt of an 11 application for a Cannabis Business Permit, whether temporary or permanent, from that Permittee. In 12 the event that, prior to the award of a *permanent* Cannabis Business Permit or *within prior to* 13 five years from after the date on which the Director acknowledges acknowledged receipt of the 14 application for *the relevant* a Cannabis Business Permit *from that Permittee*, an aggregate 15 ownership interest of 50% or more in a Permittee is transferred to any Person or combination 16 of Persons who were not Owners of the Permittee at the time that a Cannabis Business 17 Permit was awarded, in violation of this subsection (c)(5), and the Permittee fails to undo the 18 prohibited ownership transfer within six months of receiving notification of such violation from the Director, the Permittee shall promptly surrender the permit to the Director. This restriction shall 19 20 not apply to any testamentary or intestate transfer of ownership triggered by an Owner's 21 death. This obligation is not dependent on the Director's requesting the surrender, but arises 22 by operation of law on six months following notice from the Director that the sale of the Cannabis 23 Business has violated the transfer restriction in this subsection (c)(5). If the Permittee fails to 24 surrender the permit to the Director, the Director may, after giving the Permittee notice by mail 25 and electronically of the proposed action and an opportunity to respond, revoke the permit.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
the official title of the ordinance.

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## LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Police Code - Cannabis Regulation]

Ordinance amending the Police Code to allow holders of temporary cannabis business permits to transfer an aggregate ownership interest of 50% or more in the business to persons that were not owners at the time the temporary permit was issued so long as five years or more have passed since the Office of Cannabis Director first acknowledged receipt of the business's application for a temporary cannabis business permit, regardless of whether the business has received a permanent cannabis business permit.

### Existing Law

Existing law prohibits holders of Temporary Cannabis Business Permits from transferring an aggregate ownership interest of 50% or more in the business to any person or combination of persons that were not owners at the time the Temporary Cannabis Business Permit was awarded until after the business has received a permanent Cannabis Business Permit. In contrast, existing law does not restrict ownership transfers by Medical Cannabis Dispensaries and other applicants for permanent Cannabis Business Permits that do not hold Temporary Cannabis Business Permits prior to those businesses' receipt of a permanent Cannabis Business Permit.

### Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would allow holders of Temporary Cannabis Business Permits to transfer an aggregate ownership interest of 50% or more in the business to a person or combination of persons that were not owners at the time the Temporary Cannabis Business Permit was awarded prior to the business's receipt of a permanent Cannabis Business Permit, after five years have passed since the Office of Cannabis Director's receipt of the business's earliest application for a Cannabis Business Permit, whether temporary or permanent.
