RE: SUBJECT: REFERRAL FROM BOARD OF SUPERVISORS File No. 230025

The San Francisco Youth Commission voted 12-to-3, with Commissioners Adair, Miller, and Nguyen in descent, to support File No. 230025 "Amending Code to extend the grace period for additional 120 days to permit applicants to operate under pandemic shared spaces permits". Commissioners provided the following feedback on the legislation:

- 1. The Youth Commission appreciates the value Shared Spaces provide to communities and the economic benefits they provide for small businesses and appreciates city staff's work on the program
- The Youth Commission has significant concerns around delays to the implementation and enforcement of restrictions on Shared Spaces that obstruct corner visibility by not providing a 20' corner clearance, as they pose a safety hazard to young people walking and biking.
- The Youth Commission has significant concerns around delays to the implementation and enforcement of
  restrictions on Shared Spaces that obstruct Muni or other public transit stops including flag stops as this
  creates access issues for transit riders, many of who are youth, and is contrary to the city's Transit First
  Policy.
- 4. The Youth Commission has significant concerns around delays to the implementation and enforcement of requirements that Shared Spaces provide public benches or public access to the shared space.
- 5. The Youth Commission acknowledges that Shared Spaces are preferable to private vehicle parking in creating a vibrant and welcoming city, but has concerns that Shared Spaces privatize public spaces in ways not previously allowed by the pre-pandemic parklet program.
