10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
11	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
12	Section 2A.85, to read as follows:
13	SEC. 2A.85. JUSTICE TRACKING <u>INFORMATION</u> SYSTEM (JUSTIS) COMMITTEE
14	GOVERNANCE COUNCIL.
15	(a) Creation of Council. The Board of Supervisors hereby creates a Governance
16	Council comprised of representatives of all participating criminal justice agencies in the City
17	and County of San Francisco, or agencies that operate programs integrally related to the
18	criminal justice system, to establish policy related to implementation and ongoing operation or
19	JUSTIS (Justice Tracking Information System). JUSTIS is an integrated criminal justice
20	information system serving participating criminal justice agencies in San Francisco.
21	(b) Functions of the JUSTIS Governance Council. The responsibility of the JUSTIS
22	Governance Council include the following:
23	1. Setting priorities and approving direction for project development and
24	enhancements;
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1	2. Reviewing, approving, and submitting annual and supplemental appropriations
2	requests.
3	3. Approving vendor contracts.
4	(c) Membership. The membership of the JUSTIS Governance Council shall be
5	composed of the heads of the following agencies:
6	(1) San Francisco Superior Court
7	(2) District Attorney
8	(3) Public Defender
9	(4) Sheriff
10	(5) Adult Probation Department
11	(6) Police Department
12	(7) Emergency Communications Department of Emergency Management
13	(8) Juvenile Probation Department
14	(9) Mayor's <u>Office Criminal Justice Council</u>
15	(10) Department on the Status of Women
16	(11) <u>City Administrator</u>
17	(12) Department of <u>Technology</u> <u>Telecommunications</u> and <u>Information Services</u> (non-voting)
18	(d) Chair and Co-Chair of Council. The Director of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council
19	<u>City Administrator</u> shall serve as the permanent Chair. The Co-Chair, selected from among
20	voting members, shall serve on an annual rotating basis.
21	(e) Meeting Frequency. The JUSTIS Governance Council shall meet at least twice
22	annually. The Chair may call a special or emergency meeting as needed.
23	(f) Voting. Each voting agency shall have one equal vote. Only department heads or
24	their authorized designees may vote. A designee must be authorized by the Department

Head to vote on all action items at the meeting.

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1	(g) Staffing. Each participating Department shall assign staff as needed to support the
2	implementation of JUSTIS.
