[Settlement of Lawsuit - MJM Management Group - City to Receive \$400,000]

Ordinance authorizing settlement of the lawsuit filed by the City and County of San Francisco against MJM Management Group for \$400,000; the lawsuit was filed on April 29, 2020, in San Francisco Superior, Case No. CGC-20-584294; entitled City and County of San Francisco v. MJM Management Group, et al.; the lawsuit involves allegations of false claims for reimbursement in connection with property management expenses at Yerba Buena Gardens; consistent with the requirements of the California False Claims Act, a portion of the City's recovery shall be allocated to the qui tam plaintiff and to the City Attorney's Office.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Pursuant to Charter Section 6.102(5), the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the City Attorney to settle the action entitled <u>City and County of San Francisco v.</u>

<u>MJM Management Group, et al.</u>, San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-20-584294 by the payment of \$400,000 by MJM Management Group and injunction against future contracting with the City and County of San Francisco for a period of three years. The lawsuit involves allegations of false claims for reimbursement in connection with property management expenses at Yerba Buena Gardens. Funds received by the City under this settlement must be used to support the continued operation of Yerba Buena Gardens.

Section 2. The above-named action was filed in San Francisco Superior Court on April 29, 2020, and the following parties were named in the lawsuit: plaintiffs City and County of San Francisco and Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San Francisco (commonly known as Office of Community investment and Infrastructure) and defendants MJM Management Group and DOES 1-20.
